of Mason for perpetuating Testimony respecting
the Improvement & Boundaries and special
Calls of Terril & Hawkins (op^{er} of Samuel Boggs)
Preamble on Mill Creek taken at the ~~place of~~
the Improvement on the Wednesday next succeed-
ing the third Tuesday in September in the
year: Seventeen Hundred and ninety six —
This Deponent being first sworn deposes and
saith that in February in the year One Thousand
seven Hundred and seventy six he was present —
when Samuel Boggs William Lindsay ^{and others} made
an Improvement on the East side of mill
Creek near the Bank of the Creek that they

Were then employed in Cutting Logs for a Cabin
 that some of those Logs which were a part of the
 Cabin are now to be seen at this place on the
 spot where ^{the} Cabin was built. That he this Depo-
 nant does not know that the ^{said} Cabin was built
 for the said Wogs, but knows that the said Wogs
 was one of the Company that built the Cabin
 and that he since understood that this was
 the Improvement of the said Wogs and has never
 heard that any other of the Company claimed it
 or disputed Wogs claim to it.
