humane Appearance but of sound memory and possessing  
the Exercise of my rational powers have concluded within  
Myself to make my last will and Testament to prevent disorders  
that may occur after my decease And I do make & declare  
this to be it in the following form and Terms Viz

I do commend my body to the Dust from whence it came  
to be buried in a decent and Christian manner And my  
Soul I commend to God thro' the merits of our Lord Jesus Christ  
With regard to the Earthly Goods and Estate with which  
God has graciously blessed me I will and bequeath as follows —  
To George Burris my natural Brother I will and bequeath all  
my personal and Real Estate after my legal debts are discharge  
and my funeral Expenses are defrayed. The particulars of which  
Estate are 1<sup>st</sup> seven head of Horses. 2<sup>nd</sup> all my hogs. 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Seven head of sheep. 4<sup>th</sup> two head of Cattle and 5<sup>th</sup> all my  
household furniture. These species of property I exclusively  
and entirely will and bequeath to the said George Burris  
my Brother to be disposed of by him as he pleases. also I bequeath  
to him all my grain that is now gathered from the field —  
with one man and a woman's saddle And a suit of clothes  
to be made by Mr Fry and with all my 1 Peacon.

In Witness whereof I set my hand and seal this fourth day of  
March in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and thirteen
