Estate are 1st Seven head of Horses 2nd all my Hogs 3rd
Seven head of Sheep 4th two head of Cattle and 5th all my
house hold furniture. These species of property I exclusively
and entirely will and bequeath to the said George Burris
my Brother to be disposed of by him as he pleases. also I bequeath
to him all my grain that is now gathered from the field &
With one man and a woman saddle & a suit of clothes
to be made by Mr Big and with all my Bacon.
