of and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs and thereby be the better
prepared to leave this world when it shall please God to call me hence do
therefore make and Publish this my Last will & Testament in manner
& form following that is to say I first & principally I commit ^{my} Soul into the
hands of Almighty God & my body to the Earth to be decently Buried
at the discretion of my Executor herein after named and after my debts
and funeral Charges are paid I Give and bequeath to my Loving wife
Sabina Jones all my personal Estate to be at her disposal & also to possess &
enjoy all my plantation I now live on to farm & to plant as she sees fit her
life time. All I Give & Devise to my Eldest Son William Jones one hundred
& fifty Acres of Land lying on the Meemee trace in Mason County him
Paying my Daughter Susanna Jones twenty Pounds in trade at the ex-
piration of Eleven years after this date & if he the said William Jones should
die without any heirs I Give the four mentioned land to my two Eldest Da-
ughters Susanna & Sarah to be divided Share & Share alike. All I Give & Devise
to my two Youngest Sons Michael & Thomas all the rest & residue of my Land
to them after their Mothers death & to their heirs them Paying my two youngest
Daughters Sarah & Mary twenty Pounds each at the expiration of Eleven years
after this date to be paid in trade & if Michael or Thomas should die without
heirs I Give & Devise their part to Mary Jones my youngest Daughter and
Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my ~~son~~ wife Sabina
Jones to be sole Executor of this my Last Will & Testament

Shrunkill of Mason County & State of Kentucky, Farmer
being by the Providence of God Reduc'd by Sickness to very low State of
body but of sound mind & memory for which I ascribe to bless God
& calling to mind the Mortality of my body I do make this my last
will & Testament First I commend my Soul to God who gave it
hoping for forgiveness of all my sins through the Merits of Jesus
Christ; my body I assign to the dust to be Buried in a decent
Christian manner & for the worldly things which God hath bestowed
upon me I dispose of them in the following manner Viz. I do
bequeath and will to my eldest sons John William & James
Shrunkill all & singular a certain Tract & Parcel of Land
lying & being situate in Shannadoah County (State of Virginia)
on the North South fork of the river Shannadoah containing three hun-
dred Acres the same to be Equally Divided between them John William
& James equally for quantity & quality to them & their heirs for ever
or but if one or either of them Die without Lawfull Heirs of his
or body then his or their Share shall be sold & the money equally
divided among all my Children I Item I give & bequeath to my son
Daniel one ^{Wheeled} Waggon & team & one Negro Girl named Caphine
the team to consist of four good horses, the same to have & to hold
to him his Heirs or assigns forever but if he Die without Heir Lawful-
ly Begotten then the same shall be sold & equally divided among all
my Children Item I do desire the best of my real & Personal
Estate to be in the Possession of my loving Wife Ann Shrunkill for her sup-
port & to raise my small Children upon & that during the time of her
Remaining my Widow; But at her decease or alteration of her life
from her Widow hood, it is my Desire that the Residue of my

 Negro Man Dick to my Daughter Ellen to her & her heirs forever But
 if She Die without Issue then to be sold & the money to be equally
 divided among all my Children Item I Give my Negro woman
 Quena to my Daughter Lydia to her & her heirs forever, but if She die
 without Issue then the Negro to be sold & the money Equally divided
 among all my Children Item I Give my Negro woman Hannah to
 my Daughter Lucy to her & her heirs forever. But if She die without her
 then the Negro shall be sold & the money Equally divided among
 all my Children Item I Bequeath to my Daughter Ruth a Negro
 named Als to her & her heirs forever But if She die without her then
 the Negro to be sold & the money to be Equally divided among all
 my Children Item I Give to my Daughter Nancy a Negro Boy
 named George to her & her heirs forever, but if She die without
 her then to proceed as before Directed Item I Give my Daughter
 Elizabeth my Negro girl Sara to her & her heirs forever but Dying
 without her it shall be as before Directed Item I Give to my Daughter
 Margaret a Negro Girl to her & her heirs forever in the manner before
 Directed Item It is my will that two sons James & Daniel have each
 of them an horse, & Daniel a Saddle out of my Estate exclusive of
 their part before mentioned If any of my Daughters come again
 or marry during, or in the time of my widows life then her or their
 Share or portion shall be given unto her or them by my Widow
 at her discretion If of the above Bequeathed Negro's shall encrease
 I will that the increase be equally divided among all my Children
 & if any of those bequeathed die before they come into the possession
 of them to whom they were given then the loss is to be made

out of the increase Further more I will that all my stated house
 furniture be Equally divided among all my Children Lastly
 I do constitute & appoint my loving Wife Ann Threlkild
 & my son W^m Threlkild Executors to this my last will & Testa-
 ment In Witness whereof Revoking all other I have executed
 set my hand & seal the 2^d day of March Anno domini one
 Thousand seven hundred & ninety three
