 and ordain this my last Will and That is to say
 Principally and first of all I give and recommend
 my soul to god who gave it and my body to the
 earth to be Buried in decent Christian Burial
 at the Discretion of my Executors to be named in
 this Will nothing Doubting but at the general
 Resurrection I shall receive the same again by
 the mighty of god and as touching such worldly
 Estate wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me
 with in this life I give devise and dispose of the
 same in the following manner and form Vizt:-
 First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
 Susannah Beasley all my real and Personal Estate
 after my debts and funeral Expences are paid
~~Summarily~~ to enjoy the same as she has done here-
 before. Secondly I give and bequeath to my son
 Ezekiel Beasley after the death of his Mothers death
 the land and all the Improvements wherem I now live

Thirdly I desire that the whole Moveable property
 Negroes and all be sold at public sale by my Executors
 at the death of my ~~said~~ wife Susannah and the pro-
 duct to be equally divided amongst my Children
 now surviving but in case any of them should
 die Between the date of this will and the death
 of my wife then and in that case their share
 shall be divided amongst their Children.

Last of all I do hereby appoint my Beloved
 Sons John Deppoe Benjamin Nathaniel and
 Ezekiel Beasley Executors to this my last will
 and Testament Revoking by these presents all
 former wills by me made In Witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day
 of February 1805
