ascertain the Boundaries and Special Calls
of Robert Wallace's Survey as Assignee of
William Hays on the Waters of Johnstons
fork on the ground ^{said to be} called for in Said Wallaces
Entry -

Colo. Daniel Boone Came before us Sub-
scribers and being ^{duly} sworn Deposeth and Sayeth
that on the nineteenth day of June 1780
Eight being on my way from the Indians
who had ^{me} lately before him Captivity came
to a Large open place of ground at the forks
of three Branches a Muffelow Road waters
of Johnstons fork which Land I the said
Boone Entered for James Peck in the 11th day
of January 1780 on the Commissioners
Books also the same day Entered for David
Bunney a Settlement and Preemption ad-
joining on the South which Said Wallace
now Claims as assignee aff^d and that we
now stand on the same Ground called for
in the Entry and Intended for said Survey

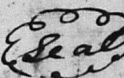

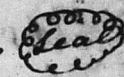
