And lastly I do bequeath my whole and sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament Truly Reading and admitting all former Wills and Testaments Given from under my hand and seal this 24th day of May in the year our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six.

At a Court held for Otsego County the 13th day of October 1805 This Last Will and Testament of Edward Gallagher deceased was produced in Court and proved by the depositions of Mary Daulton, Edm. Martin and Thos. Allen who were sworn and ordered to be recorded from to by Sanford Carroll the Executor thereof named who together with Edmund Martin his County Clerk and acknowledged same in the County of Otsego and Howard Poirer his current money conditioned as

the Law directs and upon his motion a certificate is given as him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form

In the Name of God Amen I, James Carroll living of the County and State aforesaid being for advanced in life and weak in my Body but of sound mind and memory (taking) into consideration the uncertainty of the Continence of life to truly make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all and every other heretofore made by me.

First, I do give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Carroll my bold my son James Carroll James Carroll and Sanford Carroll and my daughter Mary Healty Sally Blincoe and James Bronaugh to each of them one dollar each to be paid to them or their heirs by my Executors herein after named out of any money which may come into their hands arising from my Estate.

Secondly I give to my son John Carroll one Negro which is to be able to work to be paid him by my Executors herein after named should he ever personally demand the same.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my son William H. Carroll one Negro Boy named Betsy.

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son Lawson Carroll one Negro Boy named Moss.

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my sons Joseph Carroll and Sanford Carroll all the residue of my Estate both real and Personal - consisting of Land Negroes Stock farming utensils household and kitchen furniture to be equally divided between them the said Joseph Carroll and Lawson Carroll or their Children Legally begotten and it is my will and desire that should either of them die without Children legally begotten that the Survivor shall have what I hereby bequeathed to them to be equally divided.

Sixthly I hereby give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Betsy Castelman one good feather Bed and furniture to be paid to her on her Marriage or arrival at her full age.
