 woman named Betty also a negro boy named Ben I
 give and bequeath to William Carrol son of Humphrey
 Carrol my horse and saddle and bridle, I give and
 bequeath to Joseph Carrol son to Humphrey Carrol my
 trunk and cloaths I leave Sanford Carrol and Joseph
 Carrol to collect my debts and pay off all the debts
 that is due by me, Nine dollars due from George Melbourn
 also note of one hundred dollars a two hundred
 dollars of whiskey and after the debts is paid to be
 equally divided between the two last mentioned persons
 Joseph Carrol to satisfy his father and mother for
 the trouble with me. And lastly I do hereby constitute

 of this my last will and Testament In Witness whereof

The emancipative will of Abolom Tennison deceased of the Town of Washington, county of Mason and state of Kentucky who departed this life on the 16th day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and five in the Town of Washington aforesaid, and who previous thereto, frequently declared that his estate was to be disposed of in the following manner after his death

to-wit, that George Brodick son of David S Brodick should have his room house, and fix and all his bonds, notes and papers and every thing else he had except one hundred round silver dollars which he the said Abolom gave to James Brodick another son of David S Brodick, and that the said Abolom gave to Mr. Mary Brodick wife of the said David S Brodick all his fowls and habbages; and the said Abolom frequently called upon persons to observe that, that was his will dead or alive and more particularly on the 15th and 16th days of January in the year aforesaid, called upon sundry persons to observe the same, in our presence

Cannon Witnesses thereto and an administration of the said Abolom Tennison deceased was Proved by the Oath of Samuel Lucas a Witness thereto - and ordered to be recorded and administration with the will annexed of the said Estate of the said Abolom Tennison deceased is granted to David S Brodick who made Oath thereto and upon his petition a certificate is granted him for obtaining

be and by my said son George on the Premises hereby devised to my wife Elizabeth during her life, should after my decease become the property of the said George with the liberty of clearing adjoining thereto but not without the consent of the said Elizabeth my wife during the life of my said wife Elizabeth and after her decease it is my will and desire that the family as above described should remain together and it is to be understood as part of this my last Will and Testament that while my daughters marry they are to be entitled to the rent of the Place on which I now live and the place now occupied by Hugh Fulton or rent meaning only the cleared ~~ground~~ land with Timber and firewood to support it and also meaning this as an obligation on my said son George and not to operate against my said wife at all. It is my will that I leave to my said wife Elizabeth and my said son George as before described not only the right to the land above described conveyed by the before named Squaw - Mitchell But also the land conveyed by A D Orr.

In Witness of this Instrument of writing as my last Will and Testament I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 29th day of May 1804 signed sealed and acknowledged before us
