 many her by me I then give my land and Negro
 and stock horses and all her stock and Goods to Ben-
 jamin Phillips Son of William Phillips in Amherst
 and if he is dead before my mother decease, I then give
 it to George Phillips Son of the above William Phillips

If Harriet denies acknowledging her thirds to the land above
 given I then give a Negro Ball named Aggie to Ben
 or George Phillips or which ever the above falls to for which
 I then will hath set my hand and seal
 In presence of

 William Parker jr } If she does not claim her thirds to the
 James Savage } land I give her every thing I got by her.

 also Nanny a negro woman Slave be free and Clear off
 and from all manner of Slavery or bondage to any of
 my heirs or any other persons whatever after the twenty
 fifth Day of December next ensuing the Date the Date of
 this my said Will or rather on the twenty-th Day of same
 month in that year that my said Decease may happen.

Item my will also is that a negro Child son of Nanny called
 Alfred be free and Clear from his said State of Slavery at the
 time hereofore set for the freedom of his said mother.

Item my will and Desire is that all the rest and residue of my
 said Negroes together with all my personal Estate except
 the mare and Colt hereofore given my Daughter Sarah be
 equally divided amongst all my Children after the payment

of my last bills funeral expences are paid. Item I constitute
 to ordain and appoint my beloved son Saml Whaley and
 Benjamin Whaley whole and sole exccutors to this my last will
 and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and seal this first Day of August A.D. 1807

We the underneath subscribers having been appointed by the County Court of Mason to allot the Dower of Land to Elizabeth Boggett the wife of Elmore Boggett Decard proceeded as follows with 'stake' beginning at Daniel Coopers line on the Stone lick Creek where it joins said Boggetts land Thence Down the said Stone lick Creek to the mouth of a branch that runs thro' the plantation. Thence up said branch to include the fence that crosses it. Thence with a

line at right angles or nearly parallel with that line down the Stone lick creek so as to include one third part of said land by striking the said Coopers line. We do believe it to be the most equitable and just way that said Dower could be laid off. Given under our hands this 4th day of July 1807.

November 10. 1807. Surveyed at the request of William Byram fifty five acres of land as the Dower of Elizabeth Boggett in the lands of Elmore Boggett Decard.
