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By Virtue of a Commission to us John John-  
ston and Miles W Conway <sup>directed</sup> together with John  
Machir from the County Court of Mason County  
receiving and requiring us or any two of us to take de-  
positions tending to establish the boundaries to the  
Special Calls of a preemption granted by the Court  
of Com<sup>rs</sup> to John Sinner and entered Surveys

rel and others came to the mouth of Mill Creek

places where the improvements were to have  
been made, that in pursuance of that duty  
he marked on Mill Creek the spot marked (2)  
in the annexed plate and shown by him to  
Miles W Conway that he also marked the  
spot marked in the annexed plate with
