over and above what has heretofore been given them.
It is my desire that my loving wife Mary Brounagh
shall retain in her possession and have the use of
all my estate both real & personal only as above re-
ceived during her natural life and at her death to
have the disposal of my real estate and leasehold pro-
perty should the lease not then be expired and my
personal estate I give and bequeath to John Cary
Brounagh and Mary Martha Brounagh the son
and daughter of my son William Brounagh to be
equally divided between them. And lastly I appoint
my loving wife Mary Brounagh Executrix and
Joseph Hubank Executor to this my last Will and Tes-

named Nelson and Majon together with one woman
named Fiecky and her child Fulcama.

3rd. I give and bequeath to my son Elijah Perry three
negro men named James, Francis and Joseph together
with one boy named Abel.

4th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah
Beale one negro woman named Billie and her two
children named Washington and Caroline together with

one other boy named Culling the son of Mary

5th. I give and bequeath to my grandson William

one negro boy named Lewis.

I, Daniel Carrell of Mason County and Common-
wealth of Kentucky do make this my last will &
testament (1112) I give and bequeath unto my be-
loved wife Mary Carrell the whole of my estate real
and personal to be occupied and used by her at her
discretion after paying all my just debts - And after
the decease of my said wife, it is my will that my
son Mason Carrell have the plantation which I
have lately occupied, lying on the north fork of Rich-
ing where the Lexington road now crosses the fork
at the Riffle made by the direction of the County Court
of Mason, and which is now occupied by Solomon
Thoman and James Gile, which tract be the same
more or less is to contain all my land improved or
unimproved in that place, and is to be the prop-
erty of my said son Mason (after the decease of
my said wife) forever. And I give and bequeath
unto my daughter Jane Bell after the decease of
