State of Kentucky aware of the certainty of death and uncertain
ty of life and being weak in body but of perfect recollection
and sound of mind, do make Ordains constitute this my last
Will and Testament, That is to say I give and bequeath to my
children I can, Isaac and Elizabeth all my Estate both Real
and personal that may remain after the payment of my Just
Debts to be divided equally between them and in Case of the
death of either of them before marriage or their arrival to the
age of Twenty one years then to the survivors ^{or survivors} of them in equal
proportions, But it is my wish that all my Just debts may be
paid out of such Estate as I may leave as soon as my Executors
and Executors hereinafter to be named can conveniently
do it and to the end that my said Estate may be disposed
of in such manner as will be most beneficial to my said
children and my creditors, I do hereby nominate constitute
and appoint my trusty friends Ezechiel Norman and

William Beckley Executor and my beloved wife Mary
 Lewis Executrix of this my last will and Testament and
 in addition to the powers given them ~~by Law~~ as such by
 law. Herely Authorise and empower them to sell and
 dispose of so much of both my real and personal Estate
 as either as may be found necessary to pay debts and
 to buying the same in such manner as they may
 think proper to the purchasers and their heirs forever
 and I do farther authorize and empower my said
 Executor and Executrix to sell and adjust all disputes
 that may arise relative to the titles of any of my lands
 in such manner as they may think most conducive
 to the interest of my infant children and in all
 cases where they may think it necessary to commence
 and prosecute suits against any interfering claimants &
 to exercise every power whatever necessary completely to
 carry into effect the Settlement of the said disputes in
 all cases where they may be found to exist. In Testimony

In the name of god amen I Nicholas Davis knowing it is appointed one for all men to die and being weak in body but of sound mind and perfect memory do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first I recommend my soul to god who gave it and by body to be buried decently at the discretion of my Executors and touching my worldly Estate I dispose of it in manner following to wit I give will and bequest to my son George V Davis all this land and plantations which I now under being two hundred Acres be this same more or less one negro man name George and one feather bed and furniture and a bed room and a great deal of the remainder of my Estate shall be and be able in the probate and for the use of my wife Rebecca Davis during her life as long to her and at her decease to be equally divided amongst all my Children that may then be living It being my will that in that division my negro man Isaac should not be sold to a stranger but should be sold to that one of my Children who will give most for him And if my wife Rebecca Davis should not chose to stand to this my will then I give her one a cow and three or four feather beds and furniture and also a Chest of Drawers and every thing that is in it and I do hereby Advise constitute and appoint my son George V Davis Executor to this my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have here set my hand and this 24th day of October 1804
