Imprimis After my funeral expences and Just bills paid I
give and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy M. Goyen
my plantation wherein I have lived during her natural life
After her death I give and bequeath the same plantation unto
my beloved son John M. Goyen with all my house hold and
Kitchen furniture together with all my farming utensils of every
Description and also my stock of horses cattle sheep and hogs
the whole to be his after paying my Just Bills and the
Several Items herein after mentioned.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Elizabeth
Thompson one Dollar, I give and bequeath unto my beloved
Daughter Sary one Dollar and Beattie one Dollar, I give unto my beloved
Daughter Nancy M. Goyen One Cow and hide saddled and bed
and furniture, The whole to be valued to be worth eighty Dollars
I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Jesse M. Goyen one
hundred Dollars to be paid One half in cash the other in
trade, But it is understood that if the plantation that I have
bequeathed to my son John M. Goyen should be lost by any
prior claim or otherwise then the said John M. Goyen is not
to pay the Legacies, I have bequeathed to my Daughter Nancy
M. Goyen and my son Jesse M. Goyen.

I further Desire that in case my son John M. Goyen should
die before marriage that all the property of every Description
that I have bequeathed to him, should Descend to my son
Jesse M. Goyen in the same manner as it does now to my
son John M. Goyen.

Item, I do hereby constitute my beloved wife Nancy M. Goyen
and my son John M. Goyen my lawful Executors and
Executor to do and perform all things required by this
my last will and Testament.
