In the Name of God Amen - I Henry Hurst of Mason County and State of Kentucky being weak in Body but of Sound and Perfect memory Blessed Be Almighty God for the same Do make & Publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say) after paying all my Debts I give and bequeath to my eldest Son Henry one hundred acres of ^{my} Land on Cabbins Creek it being part of a nine hundred acre entry Located by John Waller I also give and bequeath to my second Son William a Negro man named Will With this Proviso that he is never to be sent or taken out of the State of Kentucky -

I also give and bequeath to my third son Michael a Negro boy named Isaac I also give and bequeath to my fourth son John a Negro woman named Lucky I also give and bequeath to my ^{my} ~~beloved~~ ^{and old} Wife Sarah a Negro boy named Tol also a Negro Woman named Jane I also give and bequeath to my son Nathaniel a Negro child named Sia after the Death of my living wife and to be hers during her natural life and the same Obligation that binds my son - William ~~With~~ not to send his Negro man will out of this State is also Obligatory on all those above mentioned to whom I left Negroes not to send ~~them~~ any of the above Negroes out of this State on Pain of forfeiture on the Part of the offender and the Property so forfeited to be Equally divided Between my other Legatees I also give and bequeath to my six Sons in Law to wit Samuel Bealor Oliver W Bonnie David Sheila Josephs Bealor or heirs William Robinson and John Burton to Each I give and bequeath the Sum of two shillings and six Pence Kentucky Currency I also give and bequeath to my three Sons (to wit) James Hurst - Harmon Hurst & Nathaniel Hurst fifty acres of Each of my af aresaid Land on Cabbins Creek I also give and bequeath to my three daughters to wit Nancy Joan and Lucy to each fifty acres of my af aresaid Land on Cabbins Creek I also give and bequeath to my living wife fifty acres of said Land it being the Balance of my Part of said tract of Land to be left at her death to my youngest daughter Catharine I also give and bequeath to my Living wife all my Movable Property that may be at the time of my death (to wit) Horses Cows Sheep Hogs and a

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my farming & House hold furniture for the Purpose
of Supporting herself and my youngest Children -
I also leave my loving wife Sarah together with
William Beckley to be my Sole Executrix and Executor
of this my last will and Testament hereby Revoking
all former Wills by me made in witness whereof

Survivor or survivors of them that is a moiety to each side and
I hereby appoint the Said Margaret Jackson my beloved
