 1795 The Last will and Testament of James Campbell
 Deceased, was presented in Court by John Kileen and Thomas
 Sutton Executors therein named and proved by the Oath
 of Benjamin Sutton & David Grimes Witnesses thereto
 and Ordered to be Recorded & sworn to by Said Executors
 who Together with Benjamin Sutton and Geo. Mitchell
 their Securities Entered into and Acknowledged good
 Bonds in the Penalty of three Hundred pounds con-
 ditioned as the Law Directs and on Motion of the Said
 Executors Certificate is granted them for Obtaining a
 Probate thereof in due form
