to have it my Executor giving him such ~~Writings~~ as
shall be thought necessary and whatever he obtains from
him shall be his own I give to my second son Joseph
Washburn one hundred acres of land on which he now
lives if it be obtained to his sole use his heirs and assigns
forever I give to my third son Cornelius Washburn fifty
acres of Land on which he now lives if it be obtained
leaving the line so far as to include his present Improvement
for his sole use his heirs and assigns forever
I give to my fourth son Nicholas Washburn fifty acres
of land which he has disposed of to Joseph a tanner
if it be obtained to his sole use his heirs and assigns forever
likewise again by these presents that my second son Joseph
Washburn pay to George Washburn the aforesaid
five pounds as give him fifty acres of the land if it be
obtained But if it be less I demand the four above-
mention'd Sons to receive five shillings a piece out of
my goods moveable estate and let them get work with
their hands as god give them Strength as their duty before
them I give to my daughter Elizabeth Martin my Bible
the reason that I give her no more she had a Cow and when
she was ill her I gave her money to buy her
another which money she got she had a sheep and when
she had almost a new born lamb she had a box and bags and
bedding she had her nothing else but a stool spinning wheel

a pot and pot rack she had several other things that had there
been a divide at that time there would not been as much
for each one as she got I give to my fifth son John Washburn
that is my eldest by this Present wife the forty acres of land now
in question I bought of another for with the Ferry and water craft
But he is not to come into Pipipin whilst his mother remains
my widow but after he comes of age if he will carry on the place
and Ferry he shall have the ~~and after his mother's~~
Death or widowhood to him to use his heirs and assigns forever and
likewise give him all my guns and steel traps to be given him
when he comes of age I give to my sixth son eighty acres of
Land that I bought of and paid for of Thompson Evans
that is my son Samuel Washburn to his only use and his
heirs and assigns forever I give to my daughter Rebecca Wash-
burn a feather bed & furniture, and a box and calf to be
given her when she allways or comes of age, I give to my beloved
wife Elizabeth Washburn all the rest of my household goods
two cows and calves to her sole use her heirs and assigns forever
the rest of the stock hens, cattle, hogs and so forth to be at her
disposal continue whilst a widow and if she dies single at
her disposal at her death and she is to have half the use of the
place and Place of John Stagg with her and if not to
have all else to bring up the children and maintain her
self If she marries away from the children the rest of
the stock to be divided between the three younger children
and if there should be any more land obtained it like-
wise to be divided amongst them three and if any of the
little boys die under age the other heir and of both in
their Little heirs to be their heir and if girl are young
then Samuel to be her heir and as John has the homestead
I charge him with the care of his mother I add my
just debts to be paid out of my stock and my ^{monetary} effects
and out of my effects I appoint my true
