and Testament principally that is to say I first recommend

 to have it my Executors giving him such Writings as
 shall be thought necessary and what he obtains from
 him shall be his own I give to my second son Joseph
 Washburn one hundred acres of Land on which he now
 lives if it be obtained to his sole use his heirs and assigns
 forever I give to my third son Cornelius Washburn fifty
 acres of Land on which he now lives if it be obtained
 running the line so far as to include his Present Improv-
 ement for his sole use his heirs and assigns forever
 I give to my fourth son a Nicholas Washburn fifty acres
 of Land which he has disposed of to Joseph a Farmer
 if it be obtained to his sole use his heirs and assigns forever
 Likewise I ordain by these presents that my second son Joseph
 Washburn pay to George Washburn the above mentioned
 five Pounds or give him fifty acres of the Land if it be
 obtained But if it be not I ordain the four above-
 mentioned sons to receive five Shillings a piece out of
 my good movable estate and let them get work with
 their hands as God give them Strength as then as before
 them I give to my Daughter Elizabeth M^r Hartum my Bible
 the reason that I give her no more she had a Cow and when
 the words failed her I gave her money to buy her

 burn a feather bed & furniture and a boy and calf to be
 given her when she comes of age I give to my beloved
 wife Elizabeth Washburn all the rest of my household goods
 two Cows and calves to her sole use her heirs and assigns forever
 the rest of the stock hirsy battle hogs and sows to be at her
~~disposal~~ Continues whilst a widow and if she dies single at
 her disposal at her death and she is to half the use of the
 house and Place if John stays with her and if not to
 have all these to bring up the Children and maintain her
 self If she marries away from the Children the rest of
 the stock to be divided Between these three younger Children
 and if there should be any more Land obtained it shall
 mine to be divided amongst them three and if any of the

Del^y Major County Court Robert Edwards came personally before the Subscribes a Justice of the Peace for said County and on oath deposes that he lately removed from Raleigh County in the State of Maryland and landed in Monroe County Kentucky on or about the thirtieth instant where he has become a resident, and that he brought with him for his own use a negro man named Thomas about forty years of age, and that he had not being said man for sale nor with an intention to avoid the laws of the State of Kentucky to prevent the importation of negroes for sale nor has the said negro Thomas been imported from Africa or any of the West India Islands but is a native of America given under my hand this 23^d day of May 1800 J^r.
