To my youngest brother William Moore I will and bequeath the Legacy consisting from the estate of my grand Father John Moore the exact sum I know not.

2nd The household furniture in the care of Joseph Moore with a request that he would give all for my debts to him but the bed which he my come for himself and to settle for my Aunt Alice Moore.

3^d The money which was the share of my uncle William Reed Esq^r Together with my horse saddle and clothing after my funeral and other necessary expences are deducted — In witness of which I have set my hand and seal this fifteenth day of November Eighteen hundred Eleven —

A Court held for Mason County the 9th day of December 1811 this last will and testament of John B. Moore deceased was produced in Court and proved by the oaths of Charles P. Smith Daniel Reed and James Layton Wilmer they were ordered to be recorded

In obedience to an order of the Mason County Court we the undersigned serving not at the time of death being on the 14th day of October 1811 for the purpose of settling the estate of said Justice and as to divide the estate of Enoch Brown deceased amongst the debtors of said deceased proceeded as follows

Valued a negro man named George to \$15. — \$15.00

175 Polly \$40 Davis a negro boy at \$100. — \$100.00
Jeff do. do. @ \$150 Thornton do. do. \$300. — \$300.00
Sally a negro girl do. \$225 Claiborne do. boy do. \$60. — \$255.00
Phillis a do. girl do. \$250. — \$250.00
Mollie the first named Negroes owned George Polly do. \$440.00
Davis to the said Judith Berry as part of her Dower at the above valuation and there appears to be a balance of Twenty five Dollars a Century to said Judith to make her third part of the slaves.

We the undersigned have used our best endeavours to divide the balance of the above named negroes amongst the heirs of Enoch Berry and find it out of our power to do it, to do Justice to each distributed as there is seven heirs and but five slaves to divide amongst them and from information etc there appear to be but very little a coming from the sale of the personal Estate after the debts are paid Given under our hands this day and date above written
