do make Ordain this my last will and Testament
revoking for me my ^{and} heirs all other and former
wills or Wills made done or executed by me, as
touching the worldly goods that it hath pleased
God to bless me with my intent and meaning
is to dispose of them in manner and form following.

Item my will and desire is that my loving
wife Judith Ficklin after the payment of my Just
bills and funeral expenses shall hold and keep in
her possession all my Estate what so ever she shall
hereafter accept during her widowhood for the use
Maintenance and education of my Children.

Item I give and bequeath to my loving wife Judith
Ficklin the one third part of my Personal Estate
during his life and at her decease to be equally
divided among my Children.

Item I will and bequeath to my son Henry Haysman
Ficklin my son Joseph Haysman Ficklin my son John
Minton Ficklin my Daughter Lucy Ficklin my son
Thomas Ficklin my Daughter Judith Haysman Ficklin
my son James Haysman Ficklin and my son Robert
Ficklin all my Estate whatever both real and

Personal to be equally divided amongst them when my
son John Minton Ficklin shall arrive at the age of twenty one
years except the one third part of my Personal Estate which
I have before bequeathed to my wife Judith Ficklin and
such other parts as shall be hereafter accepted.

Item my will and desire is that my friends William
Duff and my friend George Minton apply the money to
be collected by them from a certain Ficklin in
the State of Virginia due me also the money due me by a
certain Daniel Bellman or the heirs of William Craig because
be applied towards purchasing the fee simple Estate to the
lands now live on or for the purchasing lands adjoining
the lands now hold bought by me of a certain Jacob
Barrow provided they think it necessary.

Item my will and desire is that my wife should ~~hold~~
in her possession during her widowhood which ever of my
Plantations she may chose if the fee simple Estate of the
one now live ~~upon~~ on can be bought or so long as my
wife holds the same or either of them but if she should marry
before my son John Minton Ficklin comes of full age that
then the same shall be sold to the best advantage and
the money arising therefrom to be equally divided amongst
my Children, but it is my meaning if she should continue
a widow and during her widowhood she is at liberty to use
occupy for the benefit of herself and my Children any
one of my said plantations, provided my title or such
other as my representatives may be able with convenience

to procure it is also my meaning and intention that if my said wife continues her widowhood during life & at her decease the lands she may hold by her bequest shall be at her decease sold and the money arising therefrom then divided equally amongst all of my said children

Item I will and bequeath to my loving son John Norton Ficklin one Shotgun which I now hold to him and his heirs forever

Item my intent and meaning is that all and every bequest heretofore mentioned in this my last will and Testament to all and each of my said children should go and descent to them respectively and their heirs

Item my will and desire is that my worthy friends William Luff and George Morton do sell my riding carriage also my Hudd's belt and the money arising therefrom after paying my last debts be applied towards the maintenance and education of my said children if they shall think it necessary to sell the said carriage and belt or either of them

Item my intent and meaning is that whichever of my plantations my said wife should not accept to live on and occupy during her widowhood for her own and my children's benefit shall be sold to the best advantage when my youngest child ~~shall~~ come of age and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided amongst all my children & their heirs

Item my and desire is that my friends William Luff and George Morton do bind to some useful trade and art all or any of my sons at the age of sixteen years if they shall think it necessary

Item my will and desire is that all my Negroes whatever shall be freed from their state of Slavery at the several Periods hereafter mentioned to wit Syrus a Negro man on the tenth day of May 1805 Gerrard and Ben two Negro boys on the 15th day of March 1809 Edmund a Negro Boy on the 15th day of August 1811 Minny a Negro Girl and Mima a Negro Girl each to be freed and Emancipated on the 27th day of March 1814 Bob a Negro boy on the 21st of July 1817. Lastly I constitute my trusty friends William Luff and George Morton also my loving wife Judith Ficklin Executors and Executrices to this my last will and Testament, In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 25th day of April AD 1803

May the 7th 1801 James Phillips of the County of
Marion and State of Kentucky do make and ordain
this to be my last will and Testament, I bequeath
to my mother Sally Phillips during her life the land
I now live on and a Negro woman named Amy and all
my stock after my last debt as paid for her to use as
him her life time but is not to give away none of the
Furniture nor his any. If I have a child by me
I then give it every thing I then have and Negro
stock goods and every thing I then have and if she has
many her by me I then give my land and Negro
and stock horses and all her stock and goods to Ben-
jamin Phillips Son of William Phillips in Amherst
and if he is dead before my mother decease, I then give
it to George Phillips Son of the above William Phillips

If Harriet denies acknowledging her thirds to the land above
given I then give a Negro Ball named Aggy to Ben
or George Phillips or which ever the above falls to for which
I then have hath set my hand and seal

Also an article of agreement from John Downing purporting to owe the sum of fifteen pounds. And other instrument of writing from John Leach which seems to prove the sum of thirty two Dollars & cents due in favour of the said deceased. Witness our hands this first day of February. 4th 1805
