be to God for such a Mercy Therefore calling to mind the
Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die Do make and ordain this my
last will and Testament that is to say first of all I
Recommend or hope that God will receive my soul
for what the Lord Jesus has done, and my body at my death
