of the County of Mason and State of Kentucky -

John Jackson being weak in body but of sound mind
and memory and bating to mind the uncertainty of
this life make this my last Will and testament for
the disposal of the property god in his goodness has bestow
ed on me In the first Place I request my Executors herein
after mentioned named to pay all my last debts and
funeral Expenses out of the first proceeds of my Estate the
Remainder of my estate real and personal I give and
devise unto my beloved wife Margaret her heirs and
assigns but request if she thinks proper at her decease -
what ever may remain may go in equal proportions to her
Brother and sister and my Brothers and sisters or their
Survivor or survivors of them that is a moiety to each side and
I hereby appoint the Said Margaret Jackson my beloved
Wife whole and Sole Executrix of this my last Will and
Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and affixed my seal this twenty eighth day of October one thou
sand seven hundred and twenty five
