Arthur Fox of the County of Mason in State of Kentucky
doth by these presents make Ordain Constitute & appoint this
my last will & Testament in manner & form following

52 I begeth unto my beloved Wife Mary Fox my two Negro
Women Liza & Betta & their increase from this time except the
first child with Betta shall have after this day during
life as long as she shall continue in widowhood also I leave & be-
queath unto my Mary Fox the 100 of my tract of Land adjoin-
ing Washington containing four hundred & sixty three acres to-
gether with all the appurtenances thereto belonging in any
wise appertaining during her life or so long as she shall remain
Widowhood & as well & as soon as that my two Sons Sells in Washing-
ton. I give & sell on what I now live with their appurte-
nances (Household furniture and farming utensils excepted) the
fourth of five acres each in said town & their four four & four
with their appurtenances may be sold for the best price that can be had
And the money therefrom to be applied in paying my just debts &
the balance to be appropriated in building other necessary houses
on the tract of Land given to my wife adjoining Washington for
accommodation of my family I also give and begeth unto my
six Cows 6 hives & all the hogs & my three married Dick) I give
bequeath unto my Daughter Betta Fox my two Negroes
Ann & Liza & her & her heirs and assigns forever together
with one good Bed & furniture & two Cows & 6 hives to her & her
heirs & assigns forever I also give & bequeath unto my Daughter
Betta all that part of a tract of Land lying on the Ohio River
Below the mouth of Locust Creek Beginning at the

corner of the river of four hundred acres sold to Rigmans & they
to run down the river two hundred & forty poles on a line thence
S. to the line of a survey of 1025 Acres in my own name
thence East & South with S. lines to Crutcher & Clark Entry
of 8000 Acres & with their lines E. & binding on the aforesaid
Rigmans & Virginia lines will join the tract to her & her heirs
I assign forever I also give & bequeath to my Daughter Betta
Fox my Negroes Gail Bell & my Negro Boy Heaven together
with one good Bed & furniture & two Cows & 6 hives to her & her heirs
I assign forever I also give unto my Daughter Betta the bal-
ance of my tract of Land Below Locust Creek Beginning
at the lower corner on the river of that part given my Daughter
Betta & to run down the River to James Spades corner & with
Spades line & Bettrays so as to join another Survey of 1025
Acres to her & her heirs & assigns forever Also I give & bequeath
the to my Son Arthur Fox all my tract of Land lying on
the Ohio at the mouth of Fox Creek excluding the Survey given up to
Mills & forty acres sold to old Mr. Townshend Washington
he now lives also I give unto my Son Arthur my Negroes Gail &
Lotta & my Negro boy John to him & his heirs & assigns forever &
whereas my Wife at this time is Pregnant my desire is
that should the Child be born alive that I give & bequeath unto
my entry of eight hundred Acres near & above the mouth of

55 Brackin on the Ohio if it is obtained, also that tract already
attached to my wife after her death or she shall carry which tract
adjoining Washington also my Negro Boy George & the first child
which Bitter shall have after this to his or her Heirs or Assigns
forever. I also give & bequeath unto my Mary Fox one hundred acres
of Land which I am to have from Craig & Johnston, which Land
now in dispute with Wm Word, which hundred acres is to join
before mentioned to B B Worsheys line running North & South that
to be sold and the money laid out in Educating my children if the
Land is obtained from Word the hundred acres to descend to my
Wife on the same terms as the above four hundred sixty three acres
is to do & to revert to the same Person & at the same time, that the
above said tract is to do. Also my will & desire further is that
my part of an Entry of twenty Thousand Acres Ent in the name
of John Craig (my part being two thirds) that shall be obtained to be
sold, the money to be laid out in the Education of my children in the
best manner; my will desire further is that all my Military Lands
on the South West side of the Ohio River which I am entitled for locating
that it may be equally divided among all my children at the dis-
cretion of my Executors hereafter to be mentioned paying Ignatius Rags
Samuel Stevenson & James Guldridge agreeable to my Bond to them
And that I give & bequeath unto Jeremiah Washburn now live
ing at the mouth of Lees Creek two hundred acres of my Military Land
on the S. W. side of the Ohio to be taken out of my part of Samuel
Hopkins tract N. 610 agreeable to the best quality of said Land
the giving up a bond against me for about Seven Pounds. - my
will & desire further is that my tract of One Thousand & twenty

55 five Acres. shall go to satisfy Hardaway Davis & my uncle
Fox for Land Warrants got of them (it being the same that was
intended for them) my will & desire further is that my Station
at Lees creek shall be rented out & the money applied for the Edu-
cation of my Children my will & desire further is that my Executors shall
sell any of my Military Lands, in order to Educate my Children
in the best manner. my will & desire further is that my part of
my Fathers Estate coming to me after my Mothers death shall be
equally divided amongst all my Children. my will & desire fur-
ther is all my Land not particularly mentioned shall be
sold for the best price that can be & the money laid out to the best
Advantage for my children & lastly if any of my children should
die before they come of age or shall have any their lawfully begotten
of their Body that their parts shall be equally divided among
all my Surviving Children, also my desire & will further is that
Henry Lee, John A. Orr & Francis Taylor all of the County of Ma-
son & State aforesd shall be my whole & sole Executors of this my
Last will & Testament for carrying the will, into full execution
agreeable to the real intent & meaning of the same Ratifying
& confirming this my Last will & Testament hereby revoking
& disannulling all others & former wills. In witness whereof I
hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this nineteenth day of
September one Thousand seven hundred & ninety three
