In the name of God Amen I Edward Carrol of Marion County and state of Kentucky being now of sound mind and memory taking into consideration the uncertainty of this life do hereby make and Ordain this my last will and Testament to wit I give and bequeath to Edward Carrol son of Sanford Carrol a negro girl named Easter I give bequeath to Joseph Carrol son of Humphrey Carrol a negro woman named Betty also a negro boy named Ben I give and bequeath to William Carrol son of Humphrey Carrol my horse and saddle and bridle, I give and bequeath to Joseph Carrol son to Humphrey Carrol my trunk and cloaths. I leave Sanford Carrol and Joseph Carrol to collect my debts and pay off all the debts that is due by me, nine dollars due from George Miller also note of one hundred dollars a two hundred dollars of whiskey and after the debts is paid to be equally divided between the two last mentioned persons I give and bequeath to Joseph Carrol to satisfy his father and mother for this trouble with me. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint Joseph Carrol and Sanford Carrol Executors of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and five.
