Which affidavit constitutes for the purpose of Establishing the Beginning of Thomas Marshall's 1364 Acre tract.

This Dependent being first sworn deposes and says that here the spot where we now are there once stood a large Hickory tree which tree stood near the head of a Spring emptying into a Branch of Francis Creek that then & remains some of the timber which <sup>have been</sup> grown to a Hickory tree that the said tree stood near a Black ash marked TY an Iron wood marked WT. And another Iron wood marked FR and further this Dependent saith not.
