I give and bequeath my soul to almighty God who gave it and my body to the ground to be decently interred at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth

Smart all my Estate both real and personal during her natural life Item I give and bequeath all and singular my Negroes Stock and household furniture after my wives decease to be equally divided between my two Sons James Smart and Richard Smart and my two Daughters Eleanor Beny^t Jane Amblerston to them and their heirs forever except the Legacies hereafter mentioned Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son James Smart the two five acre Lots in the Town of Washington wherean I now live provided my beloved wife doth not sell the same during her life time to him and his heirs forever also one large feather bed and furniture and one new feather bed to my Daughter Eleanor and furniture Item I give and bequeath ^{up} ^{belong} to my Son Richard Smart one Quarter Acre Lot with the buildings and Improvements thereon situated on the main Street of the Town of Washington provided as in the last article the same is not sold during his mother's life to him and his heirs forever Item I give and bequeath unto my Grandson John (Bek one Negro girl by name Van to him and his heirs forever Item I nominate my much beloved Son James Smart and my beloved Wife Elizabeth Smart Executors and Executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby Revoking all and singular Will or Wills heretofore by me made and establishing this my only true and genuine last Will and Testament willing my Executor and Executrix of name to see all my Just debts punctually paid and to receive in all that may be due to me at my decease before any the foresaid divisions take place Item I give and bequeath unto my grandson Horatio Clift one Negro girl by name Clary but in Case he should die before arrives at age the said Negroe is to revert back

 Will and desire that when my estate is divided that my
 Love and I name my first Son should possess a part of
 thereof then the following Negroes that I value very
 but my son, Lieutenants Lee have one Negro man named Richard
 my son Edward Lee have one Negro man named Charles
 my son Henry Lee one Negro man named Bristol my son
 Peter Lee one Negro woman named Bony my daughter
 Anna Lee she has one Negro woman named Leah and
 my daughter Sonny Pearson one Negro girl named Celia
 and to my further will and desire that in case either
 of my sons here in before mentioned or either of my Daugh-
 ters likewise before mentioned should die without heirs
 that then the portion of such Child so dying without heirs be
 divided equally among my surviving sons and daughters
 before mentioned, in their heirs and I further will and desire
 that my second wife Anne Lee before my Estate is divided as
 above I shall have the power to give at her own discretion
 and to my son Peter Lee one feather Bed and Furniture
 to my son Edward Lee one feather bed and furniture in case
 my said beloved wife Anne shall then be proper to to do and
 do hereby constitute and confirm this to be my last will
 and Testament and do revoke every other will or wills
 either written or Verbal and do constitute and confirm
