This Deponent, being first sworn deposes and
saith that he about eleven or twelve years ago
was in Company with Samuel Bogs when the said
Bogs was in search of his Improvement. That
they came ~~past~~ several Cabins and that
Bogs Claimed none of them but when they
came to this place Bogs immediately said this
was his Improvement that Andrew ~~the~~ ^{who} who
was then in Company (and ~~as~~ ^{who} this deponent un-
derstood had been one of the Company of
Improvers on Mill Creek) agreed that this was
Bogs's Improvement - that the Cabin was then
about five feet high -

This deponent further saith that he was
present at the time when Terris & Hawkins
ap^{rs}. (as this deponent understood) of
Samuel Bogs had their survey including
the said Improvement of Bogs. that
the beginning was on the bank of Mill
