 Marion and State of Kentucky being of disposing Mind and me-
 mory do make and have certain this my last will and testament
 in writing hereby all former wills or wills made and
 or executed by me as touching the worldly goods that get
 had to be pleased to bless me with my intent and man-
 ning is to dispose of them in manner and form follow-
 ing viz My son Thos Doniphan should hold and enjoy the
 the negroe boy Matthew heretofore given him as his pignor
 Right My will further is that my son George Doniphan should
 hold and enjoy on his right a negroe boy heretofore given
 him named George My will and desire further is
 that my daughter Margaret Stockaday should hold
 and enjoy the negroe woman called Susan and her
 increase heretofore given her as her lawful right
 My will and desire further is that my daughter Su-
 san Doniphan should have a negroe woman known
 by the name of Mary as also her child a boy not yet named
 and her the said Mary's increase as her lawful
 right My will and desire further is that my daugh-
 ter Lucy Doniphan should have a negroe girl
 known by the name of Sarah and her increase
 as her lawful right I further desire that my
 daughter Rachel should have a negroe girl
 named Rachel as also a negroe woman called
 Betty also their increase as her lawful right To my
 son Wm A Doniphan I give and bequeath a negroe boy
 Steven as his lawful right My will and desire further
 is that negroe woman named Harriet heretofore
 put into the possession of Anderson Keith by me should
 go and descend with her increase to my Grand
 daughter Mary Ann Keith also my hundred dollars
 out of my personal estate To my beloved wife
 Ann J Doniphan I give and bequeath my land
 Household and kitchen furniture as also all my
 stock of every description also all my negroes not
 heretofore named for and during her widowhood
 to my cash and cashed out otherwise

I Doniphan as the other part of my personal estate except such
 a part as shall be otherwise hereafter devised at the death of
 my wife my will and desire is that an equal division
 of all my personal estate should be equally divided among
 my children viz Tho: Doniphan George Doniphan
 Mary Ann Doniphan Hockaday Susan and Doniphan
 Lucy Doniphan Matilda Doniphan and William
 Doniphan as to my land I will and desire should
 be equally divided in quantity and quality to
 to my son William S Doniphan and my daughter
 Matilda Doniphan. My money and cash notes and
 at the discretion of my wife that is to divide it equ-
 ally among them the above named children at
 any time during her life if she shall see cause so to do
 I leave my son Tho: S Doniphan also my wife Ann
 S Doniphan executor and executrix to this my
 last will and testament In witness whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty
 second day of March in the year 1814

 hundred and four hundred Samuel Jackson being
 sick and having no hopes of recovering thought I saw some
