I, Samuel Carrillo In the name of God amen I Samuel Carrillo of Marion County
 and State of Kentucky, Do make and ordain this my last will and
 Testament, In presence, I will and direct all my Just debts to paid
 for the payment of the same. I subject all my Estate; Mine, I will
 and bequeath all my Estate, both real and personal to my well
 beloved Brother John Carrillo and Sanford Carrillo, to be equally
 divided between them, I request of my Brother John Carrillo and
 Sanford Carrillo not to let our Brother William Carrillo suffer provided
 his Conduct should merit such treatment it is my desire that my two
 Brothers John Carrillo and Sanford Carrillo, should be the sole
 Judges of his Conduct, And lastly I appoint my Brother John
 Carrillo and Sanford Carrillo my Executors of this my last
 will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all former
 Wills and Testaments, Given from under my hand and seal
 this 12th April in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight
 hundred and nine

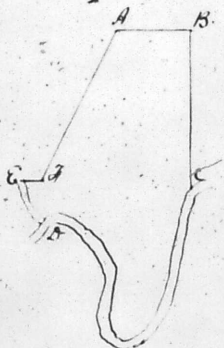

obtaining a probat thereof in due form. And liberty is reserved
for the other Executor therein named to join in said probat

Agreeable to an order of the County Court of. Harris to us directed
for the purpose of attesting to Elizabeth Triplett her dower in the
Lands and Negroes of her deceased husband William Triplett,
after being duly sworn have attested to her the said Elizabeth Triplett
152 Acres of Land agreeable to the annexed plat, together with five
Negroes to witth by James Venus and her young child, Jouniak and
Gutter. Beginning at the letter A at a scaly black hickory, buckeye
and sugar tree standing in the side of a small draw thence South 48
West 70 poles to a buckeye and small blue ash at B thence North
45 1/2 West 1110 poles to C on the North fork at a buckeye and hickory
and running up the same with the meanders to the mouth of upper
Mico Creek to the letter D thence up Mico Creek with the mean-
ders to three black beech standing on the bank of the creek at
E thence South 48 West 10 poles at F at a Spanish Oak and buck-
eye thence on a straight line to the Beginning Given under our
hands this 12th day of August 1804
