In the Name of God Amen I Mary Morris of Mason County and State of Kentucky being this day in a low state of health but of perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die I do make and ordain this my last will and Testament and dispose of my Property in the following manner
I give and bequeath to my son James Morris twelve Shillings I give and bequeath to my son James Morris one Bay Colt that is called his and six yards of cotton cloth one new Book called Geography and one third of Part of all my new linnen cloth or yarn unworn I give and bequeath to my son William Morris one Brown man with foot and his increase and one new Geography and six yards of cotton cloth and one third Part of all my new linnen cloth and yarn unworn I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Morris one Negro Girl named Luce that is after paying her one hundred dollars which is due her as a Legacy from her fathers Estate and the Interest due on the same which is paid to be paid out of said Slave and all the remainder of the value of said Slave I give to my daughter Mary Morris I give her also a box board and under box and box two eight hundred sheets two Cheekis of Common Blankets and two new Spreads and two pair of Pillow Cases two diaper table Cloths one Brown silk gown one Pattern of baliis not made up and one half worn Calico gown and one third Part of all my linnen new cloth and yarn and I do hereby appoint as Guardian to my said daughter Mary Morris my truly friend Benjamin

and it is my will that the said Slave above mentioned shall come
Immediately into the hands of the above mentioned Guardian
after my decease it is also my will that the above said Guard-
ian shall bring up my daughter and give her such school-
ing and Learning as he may think proper all my meaning
appears that is not mentioned I give to my three daugh-
ters to be equally divided between Anne Maria ~~David~~
Maggie and Mary Morris and all the remainder of my
Property after Paying all my Just Debts to be equally di-
vided Between all of my Children both sons and daugh-
ters and I do appoint as Executors or Executors of this my
Last Will and Testament my son James Morris and
my son David Morris, and I do hereby revoke and dis-
annul all former Wills and Testaments In Testi-
mony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the thirtieth day of March and year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and six
