son County Kentucky Commissioned the frontier of this
Mortal life but being of sound and Perfect mind &
memory Blessed be Almighty God for the same, I do Con-
stitute and ordain this my Last Will and Testament
in manner and form following that is to say: first
I give and Bequeath unto my Beloved Wife Niottys
Maddox the following Negroes ^{to wit:} ~~that~~ one old Woman,
named Jenny, also one named Dick, and three Negro
men Tom, Abe and Ben together with all my household
and Kitchen furniture, of every ~~kind~~ nature and
kind and also all my Stock and Plantation utens-
ils ^{whatsoever} ~~wherever~~ that I ~~now~~ have in my Possession
and also all the Land that I have in Campbell County
State of Kentucky and on the waters of main Licking
River to remain here during her natural life or widow-
hood excepting that ^{there} ~~there~~ must be as much of my the
said Personal Estate given unto my wife as will satisfy
the debts that I ^{now} owe for said tract of land above men-
tioned which I shall be ^{invested} ~~invested~~ in the hands of my son
Ezekiah Maddox which shall be given unto him by
my said Wife when called on which said Land given
and Devise unto my son Ezekiah Maddox his heirs

and assigns forever. I also give and bequeath unto my son Ezekiah Maddox Sarah Maddox and Martha Maddox the above mentioned Negroes given to my wife to be Equally Divided between them after her Death. I also further Bequeath unto my son Ezekiah Maddox one Negroe Boy named Frank also given and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Maddox one small negroe Girl named Anny. I also give and bequeath unto my son Charles Maddox fifty Pounds to be paid to him after the Death or widowhood of my wife in horses, horned cattle and hogs to be Paid out of my Estate and also I further give and Bequeath unto my son Ezekiah Maddox and my Daughters Sarah and Martha Maddox all my household and Kitchen furniture together with all the stock and Plantation utensils after the Death ^{or} ~~of the~~ Widowhood of my said wife Violetta Maddox to be Equally Divided Between them. I also give and Bequeath unto my sons Natty Maddox, Townsend Maddox and my Daughter Elizabeth Lanhann one English shilling ^{a piece} to be Paid out of my Estate and I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Ezekiah Maddox to be my sole and sole Executor hereby revoking all other and former

Wills by me made. In Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and ^{seal} ~~and~~ this fourteenth day of January one Thousand Eight hundred and one.
