County and State of Kentucky being sick and weak of body
but of perfect mind and sound memory do make this
my last will and testament hereby making and bequeathing

all and every other well husbanded made by me and what
goods it hath pleased the Almighty to bestow on me I do hereby
dispose of them in the manner following (Wiz) It is my desire
that all my Just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon as
is convenient and in such a manner as my Executors herein after
mentioned shall think proper - First. I give unto my beloved
wife Nancy all my estate both real and personal during her life
or widowhood with the proviso that at the death of my said
wife the Negro woman Juny shall have her freedom
Secondly. I give to my son Charles one feather bed and furniture
one rifle gun and one black cobb immediately after my death
to him and his heirs forever also one bow and half to my said
son. Thirdly. I give to my son Nathan Davis one feather bed
and furniture one soul cobb and one bow and half as soon as
he shall arrive at the age of twenty one years to him and his heirs forever
Fourthly. I give to my son Mason one feather bed one cobb and one
bow and half as soon as he shall arrive at the age of twenty one
years to him and his heirs forever. Fifthly. It is my desire that
after the death of my wife that all the estate that remain after
the is paid in her hands shall be equally divided
amongst my children namely Cassa Hain John Davis Garand
Davis Benjamin Davis Francis Davis William Davis Charles
Davis Nathan Davis and Mason Davis also my son in law Joseph
Spinner Sixthly and lastly. I hereby appoint my beloved
wife Nancy Executor and my son Charles Davis an son in
law Joseph Spinner Executor of the said will
