 choice of my feather beds with a bedstead bolster
 pillows sheets and blankets and I do give and bequeath
 unto my beloved wife Jane Bell the whole of the balance
 of my estate real and personal together with all money
 in my possession and also all money or debts due to me in
 any way whether by obligation or account which after she shall
 pay all my just debts and the legacies above mentioned she
 shall and may enjoy the balance for ever according to her
 will and disposition and I do not require her to have my
 property sold unless it is her choice but leave the same
 at her option and I do hereby ordain and appoint my
 beloved wife Jane Bell and James Morris my exe-
 cutors to execute this my said will and pay my debts and
 collect those owing to me and to do such other
 things as they are by law required not inconsistent with
 this instrument And I do hereby revoke any former will
 or will that may have been made by me and do now
 declare this as my only last will and testament Given

 entered into and acknowledged bonds in the penalty of
 five hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs and
 upon their motion certificate is granted them for ob-
 taining probate in due form

In Obedience to an order of the ^{sup} worshipful
 County Court of Madison made at their December term in
 1813 and to us the subscribing Commissioners directed after
 being qualified as the law directs we have proceeded to lay
 out and assign to the widow of John Curtis her dower of
 two certain tracts or parcels of land shown us as the prop-
 erty of ^{said} ~~said~~ dec^d which tracts or parcels of land as afore-
 said are bounded in manner and form following to-wit
 the first parcel assigned to the widow of ^{said} dec^d is out of a tract of one
 hundred & fifty acres heretofore deeded to the said John
 Curtis in his life time by Tho. Marshall and on which
 the Mansion house of the same stands that part af-
 gined the ^{said} widow of ^{said} dec^d has its beginning at a
 stake in the middle of the road where the west line of Clark
 preemption crosses the same thence North with ^{said} line one hun-
 dred and five poles to a sugar tree corner to Tho. Marshall
 Thence North eighty west forty poles to a small ash mark
 A.C. Thence South ninety eight poles to a white oak on the
 South side of said road Thence North seventy east thirty one
 poles and twelve links to a stake in middle of ^{the} ~~said~~ road Thence
 Thence North through the mansion house with the most west-
 erty portion of same three poles to the North side of the pavement
 Thence East with the north edge of the same pavement two poles ^{to} ~~off~~
 links of chain to the corner of ^{the} ~~said~~ pavement Thence South
 sixty one East to the beginning containing thirty one
