10 But as touching the worldly goods that it hath
Pleased almighty god to bless me with my In-
tent and meaning is to dispose of them in manner
and form following

Item I will and bequeath to my Loving son Henry
Corbis. Murphy my part of the Estate of John
Gallan (Dec^d) and also of the Estate of James
Gallan (Dec^d) is also all my right title and Interest
to any property Holden by the Gallan Family. Ex-
pected to be generally in the County of Hareford
and State of Maryland. That he the said
Henry Corbis. Murphy shall Enjoy no other part
of my Estate what ever

Item I will and bequeath to my Loving Daugh-
ter Mary Murphy all my right and Interest
to a piece of Land Purchased by me of a
certain Benjamin Worfolk in the County
of Bracken and on the waters of Kewade
being One hundred Acres to her and her heirs also
thirty pounds to be paid her out of the Residue of
my Estate by my Executors and Executors hereafter
named in manner and form following Viz
five pounds to be paid immediately after my
decease in produce at the Current Cash market

11 also five pounds in produce within twelve months then next ensuing the date of the first payment at the Cash market price and also to continue the payments yearly until the full Sum of thirty pounds, ^{or} aforesaid shall be fully paid and Satisfied; my will and desire is that should my loving Daughter Mary Murphy die without Issue of her body that the tract of Land left her in the County of Bracken on the waters of Kincade should go and descend to my loving son John Murphy and his heirs

Item I will and bequeath to Loving wife Elizabeth

• Murphy the Lands I now live on as also all the residue of my Estate whatever during ~~her~~ widowhood but in case she should marry, to only have and enjoy the one third part of my Estate not heretofore disposed of during her natural life and at her death to go and descend to my loving son John Murphy let it be understood that the whole of the Lands I now live on and claim on the waters of Clerks Run should go and descend to my loving son John Murphy as also all the residue of my Estate not heretofore disposed of - after the death of my loving wife Elizabeth Murphy and in case my loving son John Murphy should die without a lawful heir that the said Tract of Lands now held and claimed by me on the waters of Clerks Run should go and descend to my loving Daughter Mary Murphy and her heirs

Elizabeth Murphy and my loving Friend

my Last will and Testament In Testimoniey
