I Archabald Miggins of Marion County and state of Kentucky being advanced in years but in health and in possession of my reason, of sound memory and calling to mind the frailty of man, do publish and declare and make this my last will and Testament in the manner following. I bequeath my soul to God thro' Jesus Christ and my body to the dust to be buried at the expense and Direction of my Executors hereafter to be named. and as to the Temporal Estate goods and Chances which God hath graciously given me. I hereby Depose Give and bequeath as follows. ^{read} I Give and bequeath to Mary my beloved wife all my personal estate of which I am now in possession during her life except a negro girl named Sophia which I will and bequeath to my Daughter Melvord To Joseph I have given two hundred Dollars To Thomas I have given One hundred Dollars. To Philip two hundred Dollars. To Archabald Sixty Dollars To Benjamin One hundred Dollars to Enoch Masson fifty Dollars, Francis Astbury fifty Dollars. To John ^{the} my son I will and bequeath One hundred Dollars and after the deaths of myself and Mary my wife each child who is named and charged above is to have as much as Joseph & Philip have received from me, and after this is done, if any thing of my Estate remains those who are named and charged above are to receive an equal Divided, when One hundred Dollars is taken out of what is left which sum of money I bequeath to Sereniah Sales Lawson my Grandson. My Daughter Melvord not being mentioned among those who are charged. I will and bequeath to her as much they have had and to have an equal share with them at the Death of me and my wife Mary exclusive of the negro girl Sophia. I will and bequeath to George Dixon the land on which he now lives during his life. after his Death I give it to his Children By my Daughter Charity as follows Archabald Dixon John Dixon Sally Dixon, Thomas Dixon, James Dixon Maria and David and Joseph Dixon to be equally divided. among them I likewise bequeath the property in dispute at Lebanon (If I own it) to Sereniah Lawson's Children, William Bonaparte Lawson, Patsy Daughter Lawson Mahate Taylor Lawson and Sereniah Sales Lawson. Lastly I nominate & constitute my beloved wife Mary and my son Joseph and

Archabald to be Executors of this my last will and Testament here ratifying this and revoking all wills or Testaments by me here before made. In witness of which I set my hand and seal this fourth day of April Eighteen hundred Thirtied.
