and weak in body but of sound and disposing
mind & memory thanks be to god for the same being
minded to make this my last will & Testament &
as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased
god to bless me with in this life. I give Devise
& Dispose of in the following manner (Viz)
I give & Bequeath to my loving wife Elze Glenn
the whole use of all the Lands I Purchased of
Leah Stanberry & Ebenezer Osborn During her natural
life And the use of all my negroes in like manner
except my Negro Girl Sal, And all my Horses & one
Set of Farming Utensils and my Waggon all which
Gifts is to enable her to bring up my Children
except one horse hereafter to be given away
also. I give unto my said wife all my money
now in my Possession and all the Debts due to
me in Kentucky I give and Bequeath unto my
Loving Sons Robert Glenn & Isaac Glenn &
William Glenn John Glenn Hugh Glenn and
James Glenn. All the money due to me from
Frederick Libbert & Wm. Libbert that purchas-
ed my Plantation in Bartley County in the
State of Virginia to be Equally Divided Amongst the
Share & Share alike to them their heirs and
assigns forever Robert to have his share of

204 the, use money that shall become due from
Robert & my other sons their shares in Totality
as the money becomes due. I also give and Bequeath
to my son Robert one set of Horse, Saddle, Harness
and Girth for two Horses also I give and bequeath
unto my Loving Daughter Eliza Glenn and to her
heirs and assigns forever my Negro Girl Sal and
a horse and saddle a Feather Bed & Furniture
and as I have heretofore given my Daughter
Martha Parks what I think to be her share of
my Estate I give her the sum of Six Shillings
and seven pence only And the Remainder of
my Estate that I have not heretofore given
away I give the whole up of it to my Loving
wife Eliza Glenn to better enable her to bring
up my Family all which gifts to my said wife
shall be in full of her right of Power
& Power of thirds to my estate. And further
if either of my aforementioned sons should die
under the age of Twenty one years of his life
without Lawfull Issue his share to be Equally
Divided amongst my surviving sons and at
the decease of my said wife Eliza Glenn the
Lands I gave her the use of I give my
youngest son James his Choice Either
to have the said Plantations Bought

205 of Hansberry & Osborn ^{are part} of
my Estate to himself his heirs & assigns
for ever or the share before allotted for
him as he shall Choose and the share
in money given to him if he chooses the
said Land to be Equally Divided among
my surviving sons and if my said son
James shall not Choose the said Land
I Empower my Executors herein after
named or the survivor of them to sell and
convey by Lawfull Deed the said Lands and the
money arising from said Sale to be Equally Divided
amongst my said sons or their Lawfull Heirs of
the Body and the Remainder of my Estate whether
Negroes or other property that I now possess
that shall remain in the possession of my

and appoint my true and Loving wife Eliza
Glenn my ~~Executors~~ & my son Robert Glenn
& my son in Law Samuel Parks Executors

the County Court of Mason July Term 1790
 We David Morris William Hinkaid with Michael Cassidy were appointed to take Depositions for perpetuating Testimony for Establishing an improvement and other Special Calls of the Settlement and Preemption of Robert Poag who was heir at Law to Wm Poag who was Agent of James Waters on the flat fork of Johnson. Proceeded to take the Deposition of Patrick Jordan at the Place where the Improvement was made, who being first Sworn Deposed and Said that Some time in the month of June or July in the year one Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy Six he this Depoant was in Company with the James Waters Thomas Clarke and one Hendricks and built a few Rounds of a Cabin on the north Side of a Branch and about ten Steps to East of a white Oak tree marked R H 1770 Also belied Several other trees now visible and when the Commissioners Office for adjusting and laying in the Claims of ^{the} Improvements on the Lands in Kentucky at Harrodsburgh this Depoant was Called on by Col: John

Todd to direct the Entry of Robert Poag heir at Law to Wm Poag who was Agent of James Waters. It then directed the Entry to include this Improvement where I now stand which Improvement I know that myself & the Said Waters Clark and Hendricks made for the ^{Improvement of the} Said James Waters and was entered as such in the Commissioners Books and was entered to adjoin ^{on the west} of John Williams Settlement & Preemption
