In Obedience to an order of the County Court of Marion  
 Co. as directed from their October term one thousand  
 eight hundred and seven after being first sworn in  
 the subscribers proceeded to divide and allot the several  
 negroes and their increase as expressed in a deed of  
 Gift from John Whaley to his several Children and  
 their representatives which deed bears date April  
 the twenty first day seventeen hundred and ninety  
 four we have also allotted and apportioned one equal  
 ninth part of same negroes to his the said deceased  
 John Whaley's Daughter Sarah at the special  
 instance and request of them the several persons named  
 in said deed as the Children of John Whaley an

exception being first made and Observed to a negro  
 man Slave known by the name of Orange also a negro  
 woman Slave known by the name of Nancy and a negro  
 boy son of Nancy called Alfred which said Division  
 stands in manner and form following (to wit). To James  
 Whaley man Presly at one hundred pounds Valuation  
 and Subject to refund the sum of twenty eight pounds two  
 Shillings and ten pence. To Daniel Whaley Girl Sabie at eighty  
 pounds subject to refund or pay the sum of eight pounds  
 sixteen Shillings and ten pence. To John Whaley negro man  
 Reuben at one hundred pounds current money liable to pay  
 twenty eight pounds ten Shillings and ten pence to Mark  
 Warringsford a ~~black~~ boy Charles at forty pounds in cur-  
 rent money and to receive thirty one pounds two Shillings  
 and two pence. To Sarah Whaley negro Girl Nelly at  
 eighty pounds in current money and liable to pay the sum  
 of eight pounds sixteen Shillings and ten pence. To  
 James Nicholas a Girl Cynthia at eighty pounds in cur-  
 rent money liable to pay the sum of eight pounds sixteen  
 Shillings and ten pence. To Benjamin Whaley  
 Girl Melinda at twenty pounds in current money and  
 entitled to receive the sum of fifty one pounds two Shil-  
 lings and two pence in like money. To William B  
 Whaley a negro woman Margaret at the sum of  
 eighty pounds in current money and liable to pay  
 the sum of eight pounds twelve Shillings and ten
