and State of Kentucky do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament revoking all others in power in it is my will and desire that my brother Samuel Davis act as a trustee for my family after my death, and for that purpose I do leave in his hands all my estate both real and personal to be sold or disposed of for the use of my said family (to wit) my beloved wife John Davis and David Thompson Davis Polly Davis my children Joseph Davis James Harry Davis and Polly Davis each of the above named legacies are to have an equal share of my estate as soon as they respectively arrive at the age of twenty one except my wife's part which is to be paid in one year after my death to her and if my said brother as my trustee should not think proper to sell all or any part of my said estate he may keep the same together and manage the same in such a way as he ^{may} think proper as to the education and support of my children it is my will and desire that my said brother as my trustee may use such part of my estate as may be necessary for that purpose and in all things respecting my said children's education it is my will and desire

that my said brother as my trustee have the management thereof lastly I appoint my said brother Samuel as my trustee the sole executor of this my last will and Testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day and year above written
