In the name of God amen I Jeremiah Philips of the County of Mercer and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God for the same do make publish and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit I give unto my well beloved Wife Annan Philips during her life or Widowhood my Negroes George Peter Jimmy Casney Franky Sam Samay & Dick together with all my household and Kitchen furniture and moveable effects also two hundred and thirty acres of Land including the plantation whereon I live with all its appurtenances to her fully to be possessed and enjoyed during her life or Widowhood also her choice of live of my horse beasts also six of my cattle which ever she may choose also my Will and desire is that she may have all my Stock of Sheep and Dogs all the above articles I give and bequeath to my well beloved Wife during her life or Widowhood I also give and bequeath to my well beloved son George Philips one negro woman named ~~White~~ which he has now in his possession also one hundred and fifteen acres of Land it being part of the tract I now live on and where he has made his improvement with all my wearing cloaths and Gun by him to be fully possessed forever Also my Will and desire is that my well beloved son William Philips have one Negro Woman named Dinah which he has now in his possession Also one hundred

hundred and fifteen acres of Land Beginning at the
back line and running with Buchanan's line far enough
to include his quantity by cornering with his Brother
George also I give and bequeath to my well beloved Daughter
Polly Philips one melatto Girl named Sharlot also one
hundred and fifteen acres of Land which I have
before written to my wife at my wife's Death or
marriage to her to be freely possessed also I give unto
my well beloved Daughter Edg Phillips one Negro
Girl by the name of Lucy also one hundred and
fifteen acres of Land including the House I live in
for her to be freely possessed of after her mother's death
or marriage also my will and desire is that at the time that
either of my Daughters gets married or comes of age that
they shall have a horse saddle and bridle with a good
further Bed and furniture with it and the balance of my
stock of horses and cattle I have not mentioned before My
will and desire that they be sold and the money arising from
them be to pay my just Debt and if there should be any
over paying my will and desire is that my wife shall have the
balance for the use of the Children that is to say Edg and
Polly And my will and desire I further that at my wife's
death or marriage that all that I have left her in my will
shall be equally divided between all my children that is to

and what Debt is coming to me my will that my Executors
make use of it as they may think proper and I do hereby ~~appoint~~
and appoint my well beloved wife, Mary Philips and my
two sons George Philips and William Philips my trusty
