In the name of God amen. I John Doak
of Mercer County State of Kentucky being of
perfect mind & memory calling to mind the
mortality of my body that it is appointed
for all men to die, do hereby resign my soul
to God who gave it me, My body to the
dust from whence it came

In the first place I do ordain and require
that my Executors hereafter named have my
body interred in a decent and christian like
manner, that my funeral expenses be paid
and all my just debts in the first place

I do further appoint that my well beloved
wife Eliza Doak shall have the right of a

room in the dwelling house and to her best attire
and wearing apparel during her life and
be supported by my sons Wm Thomas & Thos Doak
It is further my will and desire that the plan
tation on which I live shall be equally divided
between my three sons Wm Thomas & Thos
according to quantity and quality not estimating
the houses and it is my will that the families
shall occupy the same during the life of their
mother if they think proper once keep single
together with such son as my wife shall wish
to live with - It is further my will and desire
that all the remainder of my estate shall be sold
by my Ex^{ors} & equally divided amongst my
Daughters, but it is to be understood that those
who are married have acc^d properly shallance
for the value thereof, by procuring a satisfactory
acc^t for the value thereof what they have rec^d
to the Ex^{ors} which estimate when settled by the
Ex^{ors} shall be considered as so much of their respective shares
It is further my will that my three sons & I shall
pay to my daughter Jane over & above the share
she has with the other Daughters the sum of twenty
pounds on acc^t of the land given them - I do
further bequeath to my son James Doak the
two Sills of the vessel on his share of the estate
And I do hereby appoint my trusty friend John
Bennerson my son Thomas Doak Executors of
