 of by the Court was ordered to be recorded Into The Allen Set.

Abraham In The Name of God. Amen. I Abraham
 Irvin of the County of Mercer and State
 of Kentucky being in a weak and low State
 of Health but of perfect mind and memory
 do make and publish this my last Will and
 Testament, and first I recommend my soul
 to God my Creator that gave it, and my
 body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian
 manner at the discretion of my Executors to
 be hereafter named and as touching such
 worldly Estate as herewith I have
 God to bless me with I first direct that
 my Executors shall out of it pay all my
 Just and lawful debts and the remainder
 thereof I give and bequeath in manner and
 form following (to wit) Item I give to my
 beloved Wife two Negroes to be chosen by her
 also one Horse or Mare as she shall choose with
 a good Saddle and Bridle, I allow her to be com-
 fortably supported and maintained her lifetime
 out of the profits of the plantation I live on
 with the exclusive right to her own room with
 all its furniture and I also give to her one
 fourth part of all the money which may
 be in hand or due to me by Bond or otherwise
 at my decease.

Item I give to my Son John one Negro to be
 chosen as he pleases after his Mother shall have
 made her choice as provided above also one
 Negro Boy named Sam now in his possession.

Item I give to my Daughter Sarah ²³⁹ to David
 one Negro Boy named Tom now in her possession
 Item I give to my Daughter Nancy M. M. M.
 one Negro Girl named Lucy now in her possession
 Item I give to my Son William the Land and
 plantation on which I now live except fifty
 Acres which is to be laid off for my Son John
 adjoining to his line, and I also direct that
 my Son William shall afford to his Mother
 a comfortable support during her life time
 or widowhood and I also direct that the said
 plantation shall not be sold during the life
 time of my Wife unless with her free and
 full consent and if sold with her consent
 that she shall have the sole use and benefit
 of one fourth part of the money arising from
 the sale thereof.

Item I give to all my Children all the re-
 maining part of my Estate personal and real
 to be equally divided amongst them, and
 lastly I appoint my Son John and my friends
 Samuel M. M. M. and George Caldwell
 Junr to be the Executors of this my last Will
 and Testament, and direct and request that
 if any misunderstanding or dispute should
 unhappily arise amongst my Children re-
 specting the execution of the foregoing Will
 that those my Executors shall be the Sole
 Judges thereof and thereby prevent an appeal
 to the Law. In Testimony whereof I have here-
 unto set my Hand this Eight day of January
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred one.

Will

In the Name of God Amen I P. Brunner of the County of Mercer State of Kentucky being weak in body but of a sound mind & memory do make and Ordain this my last Will & Testament in the manner following. In the first place I give & bequeath unto my Son Jacob Brunner all my wearing Apparel that I shall be possessed of at my Decease. I likewise also I give unto my son Jacob Brunner and my son in law John Thomas ten pounds each for their faithful attendance on me in my present sickness. I also give unto my Daughter Lydia & Polly Brunner thirty five pounds each. I also give unto my Daughters Nancy & Fanny Brunner forty pounds each. If either or any of my daughters above mentioned should get married before my Decease the Legacy above mentioned in such case shall cease for which purpose this Legacy was given because they will receive their outsets likewise my Daughters Nancy & Fanny Brunner likewise shall have clothing and maintained out of my Estate until such times they arrive at age capable of taking care of themselves. I also do authorize and empower my Executors hereafter named to sell the place I now live on and the money arising from the sale thereof to be joined to my moveable Estate as for my moveable Estate whatsoever and whosoever not here before disposed of together with the money arising from the sale of my land after my Just debts are paid I give & bequeath unto my eight Children to wit Jacob Brunner, Nancy Voorhies, Elizabeth Thomas, Rachel De manne, Lydia Brunner, Polly Brunner, Nancy Brunner & Fanny Brunner, to be equally divided amongst them share & share alike as for my Land lying in Washington County near the Rolling Fork I give & bequeath unto my eight children

Beginning at two white oaks vash corner to Fishers settlement
thence on said Fishers settlement line S 17 W to a hickory
& Elm in said line corner to the acre of land given for
a Dutch meeting house thence S 74 W nine poles to a
hickory and two Elms. thence S 17 W right line poles to a
Buckeye & hickory thence S 74 E. nine poles to a white oak
and hickory in said Fishers line thence with his S 17
W to a white hickory & two Hackberrys thence West
42 poles to a hickory & sugar tree thence S 39 W 28
poles to a white oak & Locust on Fishers settlement line
thence east 160 poles to an ash white oak & Buckeye
thence with Fishers line North 61 poles to an ash and
white oak thence east 138 poles to two Elms & an ash
in Fishers line thence South 10 W 30 poles to the
Beginning containing 231 acres of Land together with
four Negroes to wit one man named Lewis
a woman named Milinda their child a boy & a girl
called Phemy. We also allow the houses & lots in
Danville to be rented for the use of the heir and
widow as they cannot be divided with propriety.
