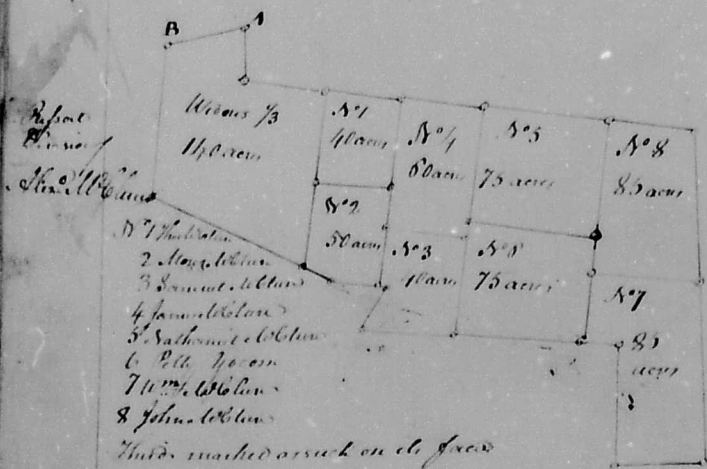


Merces County Set, Petition County Court 1811

The foregoing last and one Testament of George Caldwelle deceased was proved by the oath of John Young a subscribing witness thereto And again at a Court held for said County for November 1811 the same was proved to be true in the hand writing of said deceased by the Oaths of George Thompson John Lewis James Hagger & Thomas Allen and ordered to be recorded

I agreeably to an Order of the Worshipful the Merces County Court to us directed we have viewed the Land wherein Alexander McClellan Deceased lived and died and have laid off the same agreeably to direction as follows To wit

To Mary McClellan widow and relief of said Deceased we have laid off 140 acres including the mansion house which we estimate to be equal in value to one third part of the whole of this land which we found to contain in all 420 Acres Which said 140 Acres is bounded as follows To wit Beginning at A, a large white oak

marked as a corner and thence by the corners as a corner as shown in the map. Thence S. 20° E. 75 poles to another corner of said land a white Oak in the head of a hollow (B) thence with another of the Original line S. 20° W. 100 poles to another original corner & thence thence with another of the old line S. 20° E. 123 poles to three small dogwood trees and thence S. 20° E. 123 poles to a black ash & thence the Original line thence with the same S. 77° East 75 poles to the Original corner Oak and dogwood thence S. 77° E. 39 poles to the Beginning

We then proceeded to lay off the residue into eight shares to be equal in value and drew lots therefore And Lot 1st containing 40 acres was drawn for Thomas McClellan and is bounded as follows To wit Beginning at the SW corner of the within tract a black ash & thence S. 20° E. 123 poles to a black ash & thence S. 20° W. 100 poles to a black ash and white Oak thence S. 20° E. 123 poles to a black ash & thence with the Original line thence with the same S. 77° E. 75 poles to the Beginning

Lot 2 containing 30 acres and drawn for William McClellan Beginning at the northwesterly corner of Lot 1 a black walnut thence S. 20° E. 123 poles to the corner of the Down land in the Original line thence S. 20° E. 123 poles to the same S. 20° W. 100 poles to the original corner two white Oak thence with another line of the Original line S. 77° East 75 poles to two white oak thence S. 20° East 92 poles to a black ash & white Oak thence S. 77° East 75 poles to the Beginning Lot 3 containing 40 acres and drawn for same McClellan Begin at two white Oak the most westerly corner of Lot 2 and run thence
