divide what Little property and effects she
both please the Lord to Bless her with in
this life to my wife and children in manner
and form following to wit. In the first
place I wish all my Just debts to be paid
after which I bequeath unto my beloved
wife, Susanna Sue the farm on which
I now live containing by estimation one
Hundred and Seventeen acres with all its
appurtenances my farming utensils and
my House hold and kitchen furniture
for her proper use and benefit during her
life of widowhood or so long as she remains
a widow after my decease. Also I will that
Susanna my wife take choice of my one
Halt of my Stock of every kind which I leave
unto her during her natural life the other
Halt of said Stock of every kind I desire to
be sold and the money equally divided
among my children hereafter named. Also
I bequeath unto my said wife Susanna
Sue one Negro man named Baeleus
Negro woman named Hannah. a Negro
man Bob another named Stephen a Negro
Boy named Wren and a Negro Girl
named Paulina and a Negro woman

named Daffney all which Negroes to be for
her proper use and benefit during the time
she remains a widow after my decease.
Then I will or Give the use of unto my
daughter Sally Ottumway a Negro man
named Ryland a Negro Girl named
Mariah and a Negro woman Violet to
be for her proper use and benefit during
her natural life and after her decease I
bequeath the aforesaid Negroes with their
increases to my daughter Sally Ottumway
children to be equally divided among
them all. Also after the death of my wife
Susanna Sue I bequeath the aforesaid
Negro Girl Paulina and her increase
with a bed and furniture hereof divided
to my Wife Susanna to my daughter Sally
Ottumway children equally. Then I will or
Give the use of unto my daughter Sally Brown
a Negro Boy named Wren a Negro Girl
named Matilda to be for her proper use and
benefit during her natural life and after
her decease I bequeath the aforesaid Negroes
Wren and Matilda with her increase unto
my daughter Sally Brown children equally
also after the death of my wife Susanna
Sue I bequeath the aforesaid Negro woman
named Daffney with her increase and a
bed and furniture hereof divided to my
Wife Susanna to my daughter Sally

Brown children equally. also I give unto my daughter Sally Brown one item worth fifty dollars at my decease. I then bequeath unto my son Thomas at the decease of my wife Susanna the farm on which I now live, with all its appurtenances. I also bequeath unto my wife Susanna also I give unto my son Thomas at my decease an negro boy named Randolph one negro girl named Scitha and his increase to him and his heirs forever. also bequeath unto my son Thomas after the death of my wife Susanna the aforesaid negro boy named Thomas and two beds and then for return to him and his heirs forever. also it is my wish should the aforesaid old negroes Bachel and Hannah hereafter deceased to my wife Susanna be alive at the decease of my wife that my son Thomas take and maintain plentifully the same during their life for their services rendered me and my family. Item I leave the farming utensils and household and kitchen furniture hereafter deceased to my wife Susanna to be sold at her death and the money equally divided

among my children hereafter named. Item It is my wish, and I do hereby devise that my negro man George at my decease shall be liberated from servitude and that he shall wholly and solely act for himself and his own use and benefit finally and lastly. It is my wish and I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Susanna Executrix and Benjamin Davis and John Lake Gordon Executors of to this my last Will and Testament Nothing and doing annulling all other. In Testimony Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this sixth day of December in the year of our Lord and thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty. Alexander Davis Seal

The Last Will of Asa Thompson being
weak in body but of sound mind
I do give that my last debt may be paid
out of any of my personal property that
I may be found to be possessed of and
that the balance of my property if any
may be left in the hands of my wife
Polly Thompson for the support of herself
and my children until they come of lawful
age and then to be equally divided between
my children my wife to keep one third
part of the above property for her support
during her life and at her death to go

to my children the House that I now live
in and the ten acres of Land on which
it stands I Give to my Wife Polly Thompson
during her life and at her death to be
disposed of as David Williams my wife's
father may think proper also the plantation
of family lived in as well as the said house
and lot of Ten acres of Land which
was Given to my Wife Polly Thompson
by her father David Williams I declare
that the above tracts of Land shall be
disposed of as the above David Williams
shall think proper as well as any other
property that he the said Williams may
hereafter Give to my wife and children
I do Relinquish to David Williams any
claim that I may be found to have by
purchase or otherwise in the lot and
Plantation spoken of above except
reserving to myself the use of the plantation
and the House and lot above ^{spoken} of during
my life time I do hereby resolve that part
of my now existing ~~property~~ that my
personal property may be sold to pay my
debts and declare that my property in the
Town of Warrenton may be sold as speedily
as possible and for the best price that can
