In the name of God. Amen I, Simon J. Smith of the County of, Mercer in the State of Kentucky being weak of body but of a sound and disposing mind, and memory do make this my last will & Testament as followeth: I recommend my soul to God and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors in hopes of a glorious resurrection and eternal life through the merits of and mediation of our Lord Jesus Christ the only and sufficient Saviour and unto the worldly possessions with which he hath pleased God to bless me It is my will that in the first place my funeral expenses and all the other debts I owe be paid and I hereby empower

my Executors herein after named constituted
and appointed in the survivors of them, who
shall qualify as such, in as ample a
manner as I could myself if alive
It is my will that the whole of my estate
both real and personal shall ~~remain~~ in the
possession of my wife Jane during her natural
life or so long as she shall continue my widow
reserving to my Executors the power of purchas-
ing the place where I now live if in case
I should lose the same or some other for the
benefit of her my ^{d.} wife; and the sup-
port and schooling my children It is
also my will that as my children (viz
Lewis M. Burton Nancy Burton Phoebe
Burton Joseph W. Burton and Mary
Burton do or come of age
that my wife with the advice of
my Executors do give to such child
so much of my estate as she at that
time may think proper so as not to
disturb his self or the other children it is
also my ^{wife} that in case my wife should
Mary or at her decease then an equal

distribution of my Estate shall take place
among my children reserving to my wife
one third part of the same It is my will
that my Executors do collect the residue
of my Father's estate for which I stand
as Executor and pay to each legatee their
respective parts that may remain due
and ~~that~~ the remainder I do leave with
them to be a property to the benefit of
my wife and children I also will and
leave it discrees with my wife that at
her death she may liberate my two ser-
vants viz Daniel and Beauliz If she
may think proper it is my will that
my estate be not appraised and I do
by these presents constitute and appoint
my wife Jane Burton and David Jones
as my Executors to this my last will in
witness whereof I do set my hand & publish
my Seal this twenty third day of April
in the year of our Lord one thou-
sand eight hundred & twenty four

In the name of God, I, Ambrose Burton
White of the County of Spencer and State
of Kentucky being sick and weak in body
but of sound mind and disposing mind
only for which I thank God and calling to
mind the uncertainty of human life
but being desirous to dispose of all my
Worldly Estate as it hath pleased God
to bless me with I give and bequeath the
Same in the manner following that is to say
1st I desire ^{that} all my Estate both real and
Personal be sold immediately after my
decease and out of the money arising there-
from that all my just debts and funeral
Expenses be paid and after the payment
of my just debts and funeral expenses

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I give to my wife Jane one third part of
my Estate for and during her life and
after her death to return to the children
herein after named and that is to say George
Andrew Nathan Polsey William John Esau
Ely to be equally divided among them
and to be enjoyed by them forever 3rdly
I give to my daughter Esther Sally Polly and
Catharine one dollar each also Nancy
Isabel one dollar each also my son
James one dollar 4thly the balance of
my Estate to be equally divided among
my eight children that is to say George
Andrew Nathan Polsey William John Esau
and Ely I give to them their heirs Executors
Administrators and assigns forever 5thly
I desire that my Executors do see my estate
both real and ~~personal~~ perishable upon
such credits as would seem most advan-
tagious to the Executors and the money
therefrom to be put to Interest and be paid
to each child as the come of age after
out my wife part I wish by my
children be bound to some good trade or
business that is Andrew Nathan William
