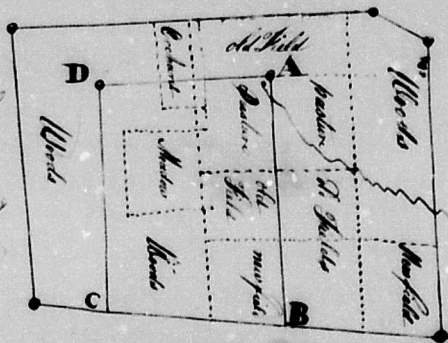

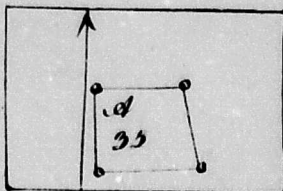

 Made January Court 1813) Thus the undersigned  
 Commissioners directed, we being first sworn have  
 proceeded & allotted to Patsy Coghill (aka Patsy  
 Gordon) one of the heirs of Ambrose Gordon Deced  
 her part of her fathers Estate (except a tract of  
 land South of Green River) First there being four  
 heirs of said Ambrose we proceeded and laid off  
 for said Patsy thirty five Acres of Land being equal  
 in Value to one fourth of the remainder of the said  
 Ambrose tract in Mercer (after the widows dower was  
 laid off) we did not take into our estimation that part  
 of the said tract which was before laid off for said widows  
 dower or make any division thereof. The above thirty five Acres  
 are in the North west Corner of said Gordons said tract tak-  
 ing Gordons preemption on the east end is bounded as  
 follows. Beginning in a line of said preemption at  
 a Gum & sugar tree there with a part of said line N 20  
 W 67 1/2 poles to a blue ash corner to the preemption

and locked Ambrose's 300 acre tract thence with part of one of its lines N 88° East 46 poles to a white Oak corner to John Coker's land thence with part of his line S 15° East 82 poles to a white Oak and sugar tree in said line thence S 88° W. 90 poles to the beginning.

There were four Negroes to wit) <sup>from</sup> whom we value at \$ 341.50. Charlotte at \$ 341.50, Chess at \$ 341.50 and Newby at \$ 300 making an aggregate amount of \$ 1324.50 the one fourth part which is \$ 331.12½ said Daisy by her husband Thos. C. Coghill. drew Newby, who was by us allotted to her by an interest of \$ 31.12½ in the other three Negroes which her said husband & the guardian of the other heirs. agree may be paid to <sup>her</sup> in money out of the hire of the others and which will make her share equal to the rest. Viz. \$ 331.12½ the one fourth of \$ 1324.50 being the aggregate value of said four Negroes given under our hands & seals this 20<sup>th</sup> Day of January 1813
