do be to God do make and Ordain this to be my last will and
Testament that is to say - I request that my Burial with the
deafening looking glass and two shof large and some silver
spoons, and all the clothes &c. thereon be reserved for the use of
my two daughters, Elizabeth Beal Childs and Elizabeth Field
share alike - and it is my Will and desire that my Great
Cable be sold and the proceeds of the same to be paid
to them my said Children when they marry or come of age
- I give and bequeath to my aforesaid daughters Elizabeth
Beal Childs and Elizabeth Field, each a certain Tract
of Land lying and being in the County of Washington
State in this State, said to Contain Nine Six and one
half Acres, being the Wlors of Long Spit and Lion, and
to be equally divided between my said daughters, share
share alike - I give and bequeath to my daughter

81 aforesaid my Negroe slave Nelson - but it is my will
and desire that the said Negroe slave Nelson be kind on
until my said daughter come of age - and it is my further
Will and desire that all my other property of which I may
die possessed in money, or cash, be equally divided
between my aforesaid daughters, Elizabeth Beal Childs and
Elizabeth Field, when they come of age or marry share
and share alike - Provided always that of the money
and cash, of which I may die possessed it is my
Will and desire that my Executors purchase for each of my
said daughters, Elizabeth Beal Childs, and Elizabeth Field, each
two Negroe slaves each, to be and continue to be the sole property
of my said daughters and their heirs, heirs after them the
time of the purchase of the said Negroe slaves to be left
at the discretion of my Executors - and it is my further Will
and desire that when my late Tract of Land lately sold
to Henry Thorman of Lincoln County be full paid for
a balance of nine hundred and seventy five dollars, being
due me on said land by said Henry Thorman within
- ten days from the 25th December 1819 that my Executors make a good
and a receipt for the said balance to be paid Henry Thorman
for said Tract of Land in Lincoln County.

and it is my further Will and desire that what may
be coming to me from my late Father's estate on final
Settlement of the affairs of the estate of my said Father
John Childs be equally divided between my aforesaid daughters
- Elizabeth Beal Childs and Elizabeth Field, share
and share alike - and I hereby appoint my Father
in Law William Field and my brother, his son Daniel Field,
executors to this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all
