

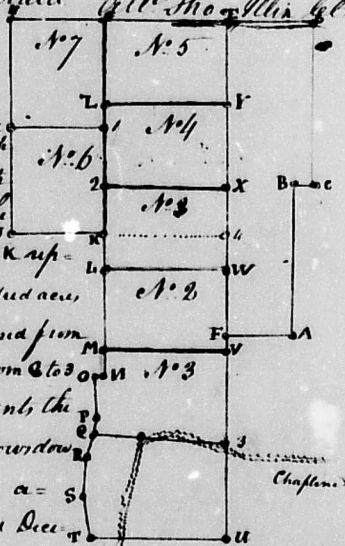

Division of Hales have amongst the heirs

Explanation

The plat ABCDHIJ/V represents the tract of land on which Life Hales resided at his death containing about 950 acres. The plat K4DT and round to K represents the tract of two hundred acres which the decedent purchased from James Alzraad. The line from Q to S binding on Chapline represents the line that divides the Widows dowry from the land divided amongst the Heirs of said Decedent in the lower tract and the line VE represents the line dividing the Widows Dowry from the land amongst the Heirs in the upper tract. The several vertical lines show the dividing lines between the several Heirs.



In obedience to an order of the Honorable Court of Merced County we being sworn have allotted to Nancy Hale Widow of Life Hales deceased his down in said decedent, lands Towel of the tract when on the decedent resided at his death we allotted her 120 acres including the mansion house Beginning at letter A a walnut and red tree thence $N 70^{\circ} E 133$ poles to a dogwood thence $S 30 E 20$ to an Ironwood and white Oak thence South $70^{\circ} E 142$ to an Ironwood and Ash & Elm thence $N 20 W 30$ poles to a Sugar tree Hickory and white Oak thence South $70^{\circ} W 73$ poles to a white oak thence $S 20 E 60$ poles to the Beginning.

Also in the lower tract we allotted her 66 acres beginning at a Hickory ash and sugar tree thence $N 70 E 85$ poles to Chapline thence down the same with its meanders to a white oak on the bank thence $N 42^{\circ} W 30$ poles to a white oak on the edge of Carys Mill road thence westward with said road to a white oak at the Corner of Carys fence thence $S 20 E 70$ poles to the Beginning. We then proceeded to divide the residue amongst the several Heirs. To each of the Heirs 50 acres for sake of convenience. To Charles Hale we allotted $N^{\circ} 1$ by his paying James McIntfield \$15. Beginning at a large Hickory on the bank of Chapline thence down the same as it meanders to a white oak thence $N 20^{\circ} W 30$ poles to a white oak thence $S 41^{\circ} E 60$ poles to the place of a double sugar tree in the road thence $N 70^{\circ} E 40$ poles to a Walnut and Buckeye thence South $20^{\circ} E 30$ poles to a small dogwood thence $N 70^{\circ} E 35$ poles to a small sugar tree and Iron wood thence $S 20 E 109$ poles to a white Oak thence $S 70^{\circ} W 30$ poles to the Beginning. To Elias Hale we allotted $N^{\circ} 2$ Beginning at a white oak corner to $N^{\circ} 1$ thence $S 20 E 80$ thence $N 20 W 109$ poles to a small hickory and Ironwood corner to the same thence $N 70 E 73$ poles to a Walnut and ash corner to $N^{\circ} 3$ thence $S 20 E 109$ poles to a stake corner to $N^{\circ} 3$ thence $S 70 W 73$ poles to the Beginning. To William Hale we allotted $N^{\circ} 3$ by his paying Richard Lockhart and Abigail his wife the Sum of Ten dollars Beginning at a stake corner to $N^{\circ} 2$ thence $N 20 W 109$ to a Walnut and ash thence $N 70 E 73$ poles a Sugar tree corner to $N^{\circ} 4$ thence $S 20 E 109$ poles to a stake corner to $N^{\circ} 4$ thence $S 70 W 73$ poles to the Beginning.
