 it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life my wife
 and heirs is to be disposed of in the following manner
 viz) Mine first Considering the ample provision which
 is made for my wife Lydia Gaar in the marriage
 contract signed in the County of Collier of our county
 and dated about the 1st of August Eight
 hundred and Eighty I desire it unnecessary to
 set forth any thing more than by way of a be-
 liever of my former friends for

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therefore give to her a Negro man by the name of
Limon and a Negro woman by the name of Anne to be
hers during her widowhood or if Anne should choose
to marry also I give her a cow and calf and a sow &
piggs and all my wife Lynns deaths or man
deaths The two negroes are to be set free also Anne
and George is to be set at freedom at the marriage
or death of my wife. Second, I give and be-
queath to my daughter Elizabeth Now and
the heirs of her body two negroes namely Lunge
and Anna with their Increase for ever

2nd I bequeath to my second Daughter Marian
Magazine and in case of her death the heirs
for body two negroes to Wm Stanley and
paying with this bequest for ever

1st I begueth to my Son Benjamin Laor
 dear nephew to Mr. D., Galatia and I begueth
 with these increases for me

3rd To my second son Elanus Gaan two neg-
ars & their clothes & furniture by the name of Elanus Gaan
Also one father bed and furniture and cold and calf
of the same then son Levy Gaan 2 gaar and liquor & two
negars (white) only & Lucy with their mends & furniture
one father bed and furniture & cold & calf

So The late ones of my State, no matter of what sort
 feeling whether personal or real I. do not my Execution
 to fill or dispose of in that way which they believe
 will be most profitable to the Regatta, and to distribute
 the proceeds equally between Elizabeth Baron or Spencer
 & her brother William Augustus or the sons of her brother Ben-
jamin Baron Baron Baron & My further will
 I have deemed to bind I hereby nominate and appoint
Benjamin Baron Baron Baron and Baron
 Executors to this my last will and testament. In
 testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
 affixed my seal this 4th day of May Eighteen
 hundred and a twenty
