Dear Father

Cher.
Lillard
Will

I gladly inform you of my good health and ardent wishes for your health and prosperity of your self and family I have advanced this far without meeting with any difficulties more than what are common on such interposis
Should I be so unfortunate as not to return off the present expedition my wish is that Elizabeth Childs and her children live the land I bought of Daniel Broadhead and the ballance of my property to be equally divided between the whole of my other sisters and Brothers after paying all my debts. I have heard nothing worth communicating to you but what you have already been informed off I went to see Mr. Taylor who owns the land on the upper side of Licking and adjoining the North East end of my and Popphams land from what information I am able together from him together with what I have had already. I am of opinion we shall hold all the land on the East side of Licking except the part the interfering with Mr. James Taylor from the knowledge you have of the Situation of my business together with the

Papers I have left behind in case I should not return you will know in what manner to proceed to the settlement of my business. I came by Mr. Will. Vanders but thought it most proper not to have a plat of Popphams land and mine returned to the Surveyor until I had got some amount of the interfering claims on the upper side Licking but my wish is now that you or some one of the boys go immediately to Mr. Vauter with the inclosed little letter and instruct him to return the plat directly and pay the ballance of the fee which I will repay on sight. I have already paid Mr. Vauter 2/3 of the ballance is owing Mr.

E. I am well pleased with the appearance of the Volunteers and think if they are not able to prevail against the Savage army that it will be useless ever to send out any less number against them. I am determined to serve the Expedition in capacity of a private as I have too much pride to wish to occupy any office that no other person could
