my last will & testament hereby revoking
all former wills by me made First I give
my soul into the hand of almighty God
and my body to the earth from whence
it came In hopes of a happy resurrection through
the merits of our Lord & saviour Jesus Christ
and as to my worldly effects I dispose of in
the following manner Imprimis I give & bequeath
unto my son Robert W Davis the land whereon
I now live with the appurtenances for & during
his natural life and the life or widowhood of
his my said sons wife Polly Davis to be by them
occupied & used for there maintenance and the
raising & schooling of my Grand children by
them lawfully begotten and at the death of my
said son Robert and the death or marriage of
his said wife I give my said tract of land unto
my two grand sons Cyrus Aaron Davis & Robert
Augustine Davis sons of my said son Robert W
Davis & Polly his wife to be equally divided between
them there heirs or assigns forever I also give my
Negro Mansfield to my son Robert W Davis his heirs or
assigns forever I give unto my Daughter Polly
Davis my Negroes Daniel Hannah & Amy &
to her heirs or assigns forever as I have already
heretofore given to my Daughter Sarah Letcher
two negroes I now give my negro woman Lucy to
my said Daughter Sarah during her life
& at her death I give Lucy & her increase to

my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Saw Letcher he heirs
or assigns forever I also give my negro Rachel Parviter
to my said Daughter Sarah & her heirs forever my
negro Phillis I give to which of my children she may
choose to live with my negro Phillip I give to my
grandson Robert Augustine Davis his heirs or assigns
forever my negro Tom I give to my grand Daughter
Elizabeth Rebecca Davis her heirs or assigns forever
My negro ^{George} I give to my grandson Cyrus Aaron Davis
his heirs or assigns forever To the heirs of my son
Thomas Davis I give my best & best furniture I should
have given them more but I have already done a
sufficient part for my said son Thomas & Davis
All the residue of my property I desire to be sold
out of which my debts are to be paid & the remainder
to be equally divided amongst all my children
and lastly I appoint my son Robert W Davis &
Stephen J Letcher executors of this my last will signed
this 22nd 1811

I Robert McCarney of the County of Mercer and State of Kentucky being in an firm State of health a present but in perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for his mercies to me, calling to mind the mortality of the body and that it is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and Testament first I recommend my soul to God that gave

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it and my body to be buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors: And as touching such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me with. I order and dispose of in the manner and form following first that all my just debts be paid out of the whole of my estate. And the remainder to be ^{divided} in the manner and form following. That is to say to my wellbeloved wife, Rebecca I give and bequeath the third of my real estate and the dwelling house (except that part of my land that I gave to my son John she shall have no claim upon it) and likewise one third of my personal estate and at her death my grandson George McCarney shall have to the value of one hundred Dollars out of her part and the remainder of her part to be disposed of at her death according to her pleasure, and to my Daughter Mary while she remains single shall have her living in the house as formerly and shall have a sufficient quantity of flax and hemp provided for her so that she may do something for herself and when she shall marry she shall be provided for and in all respects made equal to what my other Daughters got when they were married and over and above one featherbed and all the clothes belonging to one Cow and six Sheep and while she remains single there shall a horse kept for her when she shall have an occasion to ride out and my Books is not to be taken into the partition of my estate. but they are to be equally divided among all my Children viz John, George, Margaret, Elizabeth, Mary and Robert is to have my house Bible more than his share, and the same volume of school
