wise three hundred acres purchased from Evan Hinton
by virtue of a Bond given by him & Hinton likewise
two hundred and fifty acres purchased from Lewis Bond
during his residence in Carolina he giving lawful bond
for the same. all the above mentioned land for the use
above mentioned and their Heirs forever.

Item— I Give and bequeath unto my beloved Son John
than two thirds of five hundred acres of land which falls to
him by the death of his sister Sarah Deceased being her
own by a gift and now to be his & his Heirs forever. Also
I Give and bequeath unto my Son Jonathan one black
boy worth a white face marked with a red in the right
Ear and an iron bit in the same ear and a set in the
of ear and one Boat to be his. Item— I Give and be-
queath unto my Daughter Phoebe not hereunto mentioned
